The separation of the Continuation school from the Public school meant an increased Government grant. There were also moral advantages in having the schools separate.

As to the cost of a building properly equipped, he would place an estimate of about \$12,000. It might be done for \$10,000. This would mean about a 2-mill increase in the tax rate on a 20year debenture. He also showed that the Continuation school, except for maintenance, was not very heavy on the town directly. In Durham, the teachers' salaries amount to \$2400, while the grants and fees received total up to more than \$2100.
