SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS

ANY PERSON who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta.

Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Duties.—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.

LIBRARY WORKERS MEET AT HANOVER.

Hanover, March 13.—The splendid new Carnegie public library, just erected here at a cost of \$10,000, was given a good send-off by the meeting of the Orangeville district Library Institute, held here on Tuesday.

The morning session's program was made up of short papers and discussions regarding library questions in the district. In the afternoon, Library Inspector W. R. Nursey gave an address on the work in the Orangeville district.

In the evening, there was a public meeting, which taxed the capacity of the lecture hall. Mr. H. H. Burgess, B.A., of Owen Sound, was chairman, and addresses and papers were given by Inspector Nursey, by Rev. Mr. Marschener, of Hanover, on "The Value of a Good Book," and by Librarian Carson, of London, on "Self-Culture."

The new library building is a splendidly planned structure. In the basement there is a spacious lecture hall. On the main floor there are good-sized stock rooms and three separate reading rooms for men, women and children.
