Nichol—Young—That the council build a six-foot close fence between the hall and the shed and from the south-east corner of the shed to the road.—Carried.

McMillan—Lindsay—That Dominion Express Co. be paid \$1.25 charges on three express parcels.—Car.

McMillan—Young—That J. A. McDonald, assessor, be paid \$50 on salary on returning of the roll.—C.

Lindsay—McMillan—That the clerk be paid \$10 on salary.—Car.

The first bill introduced at the newly opened session of the British Columbia Legislature in Victoria was an act to ratify an agreement between the Government and Messrs. Foley, Welsh and Stewart, and between that firm and the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway Company for the construction of a railway from the city of Vancouver to Fort George. The first agreement provides for construction and the second that the Grand Trunk Pacific shall have the first option of purchase and shall have running rights over the line.

The Premier, in introducing the bill, said it provided for the construction of what was commonly known as the Vancouver-Fort George Railway. It would be of standard gauge and would run from Vancouver to connect with the G. T. P. at Fort George. It would receive from the Provincial Government a subvention equal to that already given to the C. N. R. in the guarantee of its bonds for \$35,000. Provision would also be made for adequate traffic connection with the cities of New Westminster and Victoria. Construction on this line which is to be built under the corporate name of the Pacific Great Eastern Railway, will be started within ten miles of Vancouver by July 1.
