THE INTERNATIONAL SERIES.

Text of the Lesson, Luke vi, 27-38; Rom. xiii, 8-10-Memory Verses, 27, 28-Golden Text, Rom. xiii, 9-Commentary Prepared by Rev. D. M. Stearns.

The topic of this lesson is "Love,"

and the pattern is "the love of God."

At first sight the teaching is most extraordinary and the practice seemingly impossible and beyond all reason. Great grace might enable us to love our enemies, do good to those who hate us, bless those who curse us and pray for such as despitefully use us, but when it comes to lending without hoping for a return, giving to every one that asks and letting the man that takes your cloak have your coat also it does look like a good time for tramps, impostors, thieves and robbers. We know that the righteous Lord loveth righteousness, and anything unrighteous He would not do nor ask us to do, so we must prayerfully wait upon Him for the object is that we may be mani-The bonds will be dated 1st May, festly "the children of the Highest," in heaven." It is therefore not a matter of what is expedient or according to reason, but how can we had received Him as the Christ, the Son of God, and had left all to follow Him, those whom He was to leave in the world in His stead, that because of them the world might believe and know the only living and true God the world to manifest Him (John xvii, 3, 11, 21, 23). It is truly a high, holy, heavenly calling to represent God and Christ in the power of the Holy Spirit and be so alive to their interests that we shall be wholly dead to our own.

The love of God and of Jesus Christ and there are no more wonderful statements concerning it than John iii, 16; I John iii, 16.

Put with these "God commendeth His interest accrued from the 1st May, love toward us in that while we were yet sinners Christ died for us." "In this was manifested the love of God only begotten Son into the world that we might live through Him." "He spared not His own Son, but delivered Him up for us all." "Christ loved the

church and gave Himself for it." "The church of God which He hath purchased with His own blood." "The self for me" (Rom. v. 8; vili, 32; I John iv. 9, 10; Eph. v. 25; Acts xx, 28; Gal. ii, 30). In the light of such tremendous statements consider the treatment that He received when here Provincial Treasure", in humiliation and even as He taught special people Israel, but they received Him not. Their rulers had no kind words or thoughts for Him. They said that He had a devil and was mad and that He deceived the people, and in their hatred they finally killed Him. accusing Him falsely and giving Him no semblance of a fair trial (John I, 10, 11; vii, 12, 20; viii, 52; x, 20). Yet He bore it all patiently and did not talk back nor strike back, though He might look or a word, as He will do at His coming in glory to set up His kingdom and share it with His own redeemed ones (Isa. xi, 4; II Thess. ii, 8;

Col. iii, 4; Rev. iii, 21). Now, considering that by such love and by the sacrifice of Himself He has at such infinite cost and by such body, made all who receive Him children of God and joint heirs with Himself, partakers of His kingdom and glory, does it not look a good bit easier to love, to bless, to help others for His sake, to give, to lend, to do good, hoping for nothing again, to turn? Do we not feel like saying as Mephibosheth said of Ziba, "Yea, let him take all, forasmuch as my Lord the King is come again" (II Sam. xix,

Our Lord never encouraged wrongdoing, and we may be sure that He would not have us do anything to encourage injustice and oppression, theft or robbery or idleness or anything of the spirit that would wrongfully take the property of another. But He would have us show in our daily life that we have such treasure in Himself and in His kingdom that we are ready to use all present things for the good of others if only we may win them to Him, bearing meekly any loss or cross for His sake. The love of Christ constraineth us to live no longer unto ourselves, but unto Him who died for us and rose again (I Cor. v, 14, 15). Since Paul could take pleasure in infirmities, in the bearing of insults, in distress, in persecutions, in grievous difficulties, for Christ's sake (II Cor. xii, 10, Waymouth), the same grace is at our disposal, to enable us to reckon all loss as mere refuse because of the priceless privilege of knowing Christ Jesus as could lend or give or go or bear any loss because of such love and because


