A Paper Read by J J Pratt, Editor of The Owen Sound Herald, at the Meeting of The Grey & Bruce Press Association in Harriston, May 18th

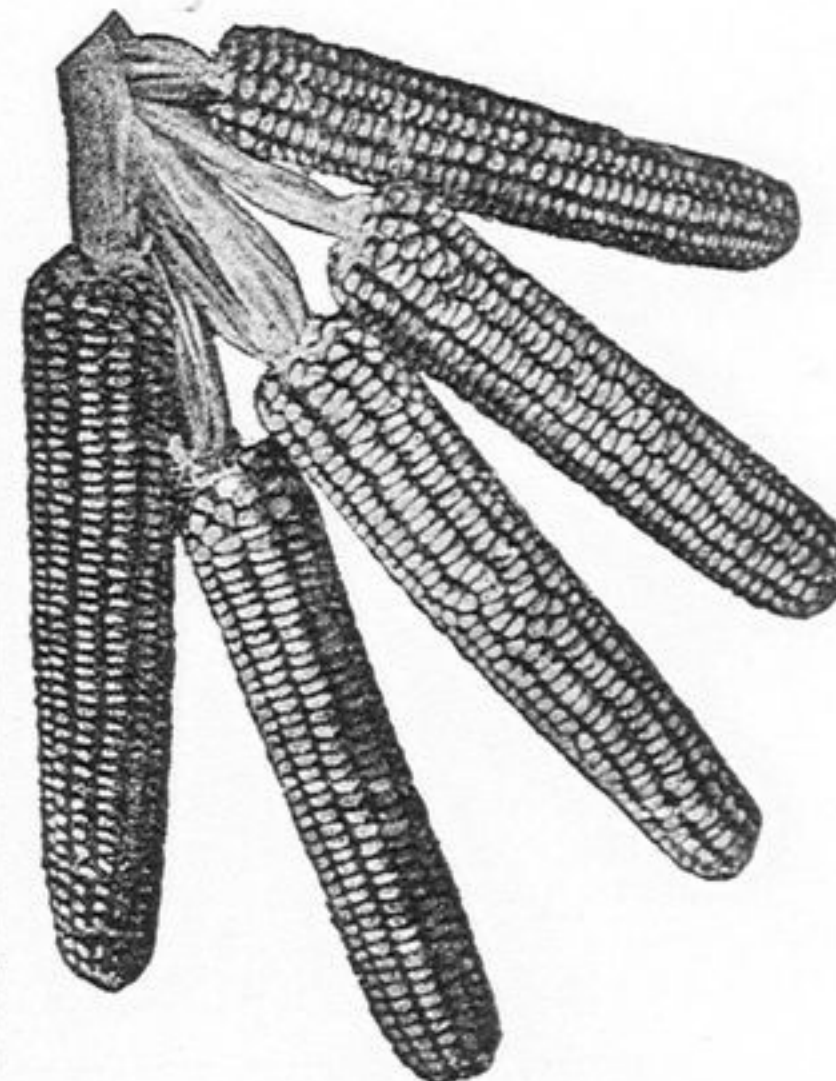
