THE INTOXICATED PASSENGER.

There is a strong opinion prevailing among railway officials in Canada that a law should be placed on the statute books to deal promptly with that not uncommon nuisance, an intoxicated passenger. The suggestion has been made that in Canada it would be well if Parliament would enact a law similar to that existing in the State of Illinois, which makes it an offense punishable by fine or imprisonment, or both, for any person to drink intoxicating liquor or to be intoxicated on any passenger train, or in or about any railway station.
