SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS

ANY PERSON who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta.

Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years.

In certain districts a homestead-er in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Duties.—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre.
