SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS. ANY PERSON who is the sole

head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quartersection of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Doninion Lands Agency, or Sub-agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions by father, mother. son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader. Duties .- Six months' residence

upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years A homesteader may live withir nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 50 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead, Price \$3,00 per acre. Duties .- Must reside upon the

homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra,

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts.
