### COLORS OF THE NATIONS.

Has it ever struck you which color is most often seen in the flags of the world? Probably it hasn't because there are not many people who can recognize more than a dozen flags at the outside. Well, the most popular color is red, which is found in the standard of no fewer than 19 countries out of 25. Practically every one of the European states, together with Mexico, Venezuela, Chile, Cuba and the United States, boast the color red in their national flags.

Blue is found in the emblems of Great Britain, the United States, Russia, France, Holland, Ecuador, Sweden, Chile, Portugal, Venezuela and Cuba. Black is not at all popular, being found only in the cases of Germany, Belgium and China, while Germany is noticeable for having black and white together. Nine countries boast of a flag partly yellow, Austria, Spain, Belgium, Brazil, Persia, Sweden, Egypt, China and Venezuela. To Ecuador belongs the distinction of having a standard nearer white than any other country.
