Text of the Lesson, Gen. xliii, 18, 19, 23-34 - Memory Verses, 29, 30 - Golden Text, 1 John 2:10 - Commentary Prepared by Rev. D. M. Stearns.

Because of Jacob's determination not to let Benjamin go to Egypt and the determination of the sons not to go without him they tarried till the corn which they had brought was consumed. Then when they had to go or starve Judah pleaded with his father, saying: "Send the lad with me, and we will arise and go. I will be surety for him" (Gen. 43:9). This is all so suggestive, for the great and only surety, the Lord Jesus, came from the tribe of Judah (Heb. vii, 14), and in one of the great "Who is this?" verses concerning Him it is written, "Who is He that hath been surety for his heart to approach unto me?" LICENSE REDUCTION IN BRUCE

On May 1st there were issued in the County of Bruce only 33 liquor licenses, in 1874 there were 159 licenses and 25 shop licenses, making in all 205 places in which to secure liquor in this county. The reduction in the number of licensed hotels and shops in 39 years from 205 to 33 is 83 per cent, and goes to show the growth of temperance sentiment in the province of Ontario.

There were nearly four years in which there were no licenses issued in this county. The Dunkin Act was carried in 1877 by a majority of 1142 and after being in force for ten months was repealed by a majority of 1679. In 1884 the Scott Act was carried by a majority of 1321 and was repealed in 1888 by a majority of 3735 was given in 1894 a majority of 2165 for prohibition and at the Dominion Plebiscite in 1895 a referendum was submitted and the prohibition of the sale of liquor in Ontario by a majority of 3,812.—Exchange.

Put a piece of writing paper in the oven, and if it browns a light brown in five minutes the oven is the right heat for loaf cake. Small cakes and layer cakes require a hotter oven. If the paper is dark brown at the end of five minutes partly cool the oven and test again just before putting the cake in. Another test is to hold the hand in the oven and count twenty. If this can be done comfortably, the temperature is right for loaf cake baking. If the gas oven is used the cake should be put in the centre of the top grate. Open and shut the doors of the oven very carefully after the cake is in. Do not turn after the cake after it is into the oven the cake after it is into the oven until it is nearly done. Some good bakers advise never turning the cake, even if it is baking unevenly. If the cake seems with a piece of too fast cover with a piece of writing paper after it has been in the oven for at least twenty minutes.—Woman's World for June.
