### THE LATE W. H. LEE.

The late W. H. Lee, who died on the 25th of April, was born in the county of Tyrone, Ireland, in 1840, and came to this country in 1848 with his parents and settled in the township of Ajala. In 1854 he came to the township of Egremont and settled for a time on the 18th concession. Thirty-nine years ago he moved to the 21st concession. He leaves a widow and three children living. Six of the family died within four days 22 years ago. The surviving members of the family are Frederick, in Alberta, and Isabella and Arthur at home. He also leaves one brother, Robert Lee, in Ajala, one half-brother, Samuel Acheson, in Dakota, and two half-sisters, Mrs. Wm. Hill, in Bentinck, and Mrs. James Acheson, in Dakota. He was married on the 17th of November, 1874, to Ellen M. Matthews, sister of Mr. James Matthews, of Egremont. He was an Anglican in religion and a Conservative in politics. The pall bearers were A. Crutchley, J. Matthews, Jos. Patterson, David Hamilton, S. Patterson, Egremont, and W. Ferguson. He was a member of the Orange Order for 56 years.
