In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may preempt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3 per acre. Duties .- Six months residence in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and 50 acres extra cultivation. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land after report by Homestead Inspector on application for patent.
