GUELPH MAY SOON HAVE FREE MARKET.

Guelph, Sept. 24.—At a meeting of the local Board of Trade the question of making the Guelph market site a free one was discussed at length. It was the opinion of the majority of the members that Guelph should have a free market, and it is likely that at the next meeting of the board a resolution will be passed recommending that the city council take action and abolish the fee system which at present prevails.

TWO FINE HORSES BURNED IN FIELD.

Pierre Phalen, of Proton township, lost a valuable team of horses in a peculiar manner. Mr. Phalen had been burning the black muck from a field he was clearing and was plowing in an adjoining field, when he noticed that the fence was on fire. He tied the horses, in order to try and save the fence. Shortly after he left raised a heavy volume of smoke, completely shutting out his view of the horses. After pulling down the fence he returned to find that the horses had been frightened and run away, taking the plow with them. After running around the field a couple of times they ran into the burning ground and fell down, one on top of the other. By the time Mr. Phalen found and released them they were so badly burned that one died shortly after, and the other is likely to lose at least two of the hoofs, which will render it useless. The loss is quite a heavy one as Mr. Phalen had

fitting them up to dispose of them as a hearse team, they being perfectly matched and jet black.

LORD METHUEN WILL ACCEPT

London, Sept. 24.—The Bystander says that the post of Governor-General of Canada, on the retirement of the Duke of Connaught, has been offered to Field-Marshal Lord Methuen, and that he is likely to accept.

Lord Methuen, G.C.B., K.C.B., G.C.V.O., K.C.V.O., C.B., C.M.G., was born in Somersetshire, in 1845, and has had a stirring military career. He served on the Gold Coast of Africa in 1873, with the Ashanti Expedition in 1874, and in the Egyptian campaign in 1882. He commanded Methuen's Horse in the Bechuanaland, South Africa expedition of 1884-5, and on the outbreak of the Boer War in 1899 took command of the first infantry division. He was wounded and taken prisoner by General Delarey in March, 1902, but his captor generously released him. He had the Eastern home command, 1903-5, and in 1907-9 was commander-in-chief in South Africa. In 1909 he was Governor of Natal.
