Mr. C. P. Birge of Hamilton gave an illustration of this in the case of a man who has been unable to collect his son's life insurance, lacking proof of death.

"We wouldn't be doing our whole duty to the soldier if the dependents were allowed to fall during his absence to a lower scale mentally, morally or physically than that which he left," said Sir Herbert Ames.
