Mrs. P. Gagnon and little daughter, Norma, visited friends at Hamilton last week.

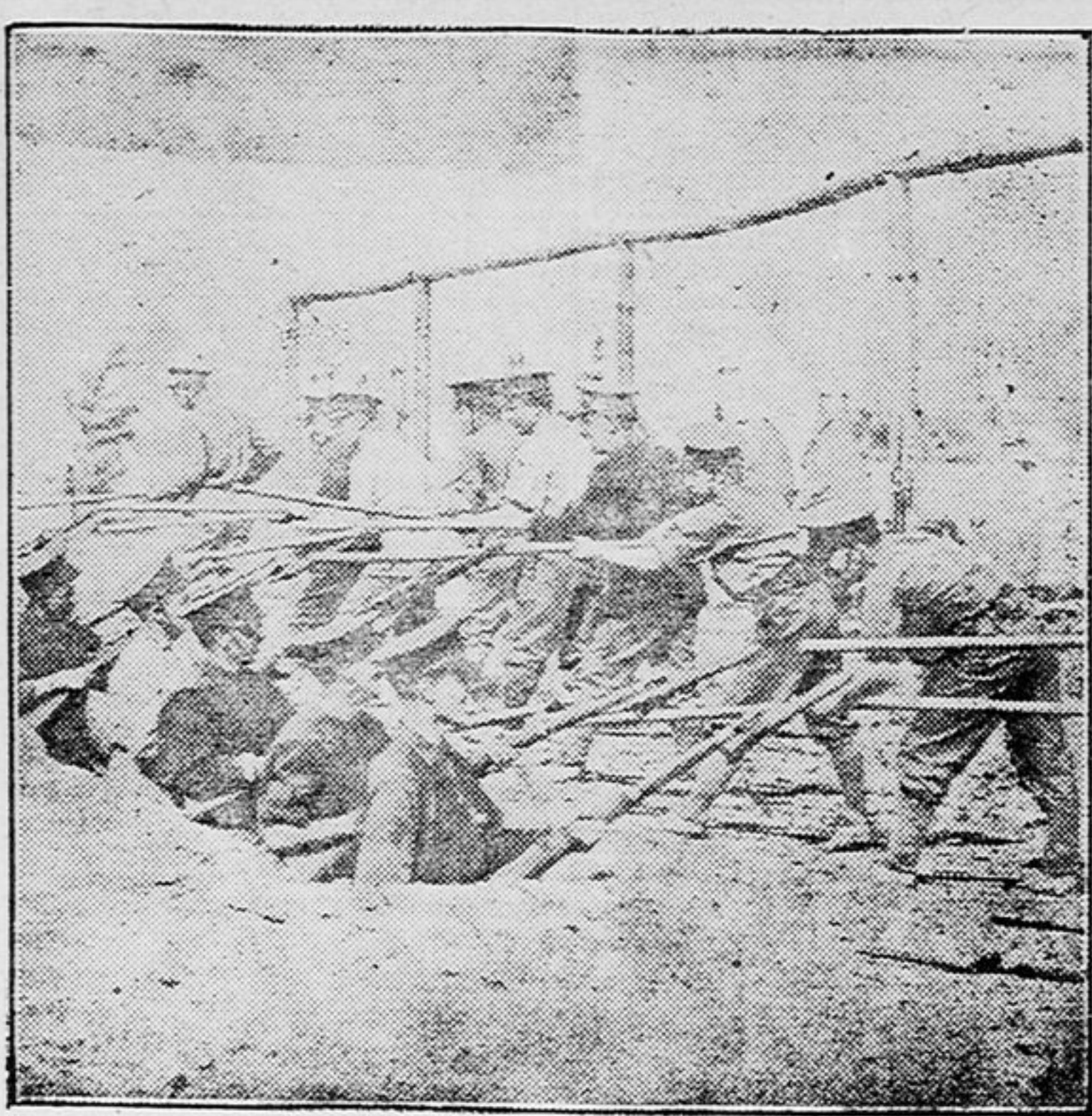
