ARTIFICIAL KIDNEY CAN PURIFY BLOOD

Pumps It From the Body, Extracts the Disease Germs and Returns Glean, Healthy Fluid to Veins


That all of a human being's blood can be pumped out of the arteries, But shall play in healthful fields cleaned in an artificial kidney and pumped back into the body is claimed by learned doctors of Johns Hopkins University at Baltimore.

> With the perfection of the marvelous new apparatus which has been put out from the pharmacological laboratory of Johns Hopkins university under the supervision of Dean William H. Welch, some of the most vexing problems of the day probably will be solved. Kidney diseases are increasing with alarming rapidity. It is thought that the Johns Hopkins artificial kidney in many cases will be successfully used to perform the blood purifying function in which the diseased natural kidney fails.

The apparatus consists of 32 tubes contained in a glass case. The tubes, made of a substance called celloidin. are connected at one end with a single tube which may be attached to an artery, and at the other with a tube which leads to a vein. Before the artificial kidney it attached to the body, the tubes are filled with a solution of salt and water. When it

the blood is purified.

is put in position, the heart pumps the blood out from the artery into the tubes and forces the salt solution back into the veins to take its place. While in the tubes the blood is by dialysis—a process by which harmful substances contained in the blood seep through the delicate celloidin walls of the tubes into a fluid which s held in the outer space between the tubes and the glass case. By changing the composition of this fluid the physician can determine what substances shall pass into it by dialy-


ais of the blood. This astounding machine was used with complete success on dogs and other animals. The three physicians who made it, Dr. John J. Abel, Dr. Leonard C. Rowntree and Dr. D. B. Turner, are elaborating an artificial kidney which they expect will be used on humans with perfect safety, and will be invaluable for cleansing impure blood.
