SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS The sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency). on certain conditions. Duties .- Six months' residence

upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homean steader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is re-Prop'r Middaugh House. | quired except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions. In certain districts a home-

Macaw of the Tropics Not Much a Linguist


