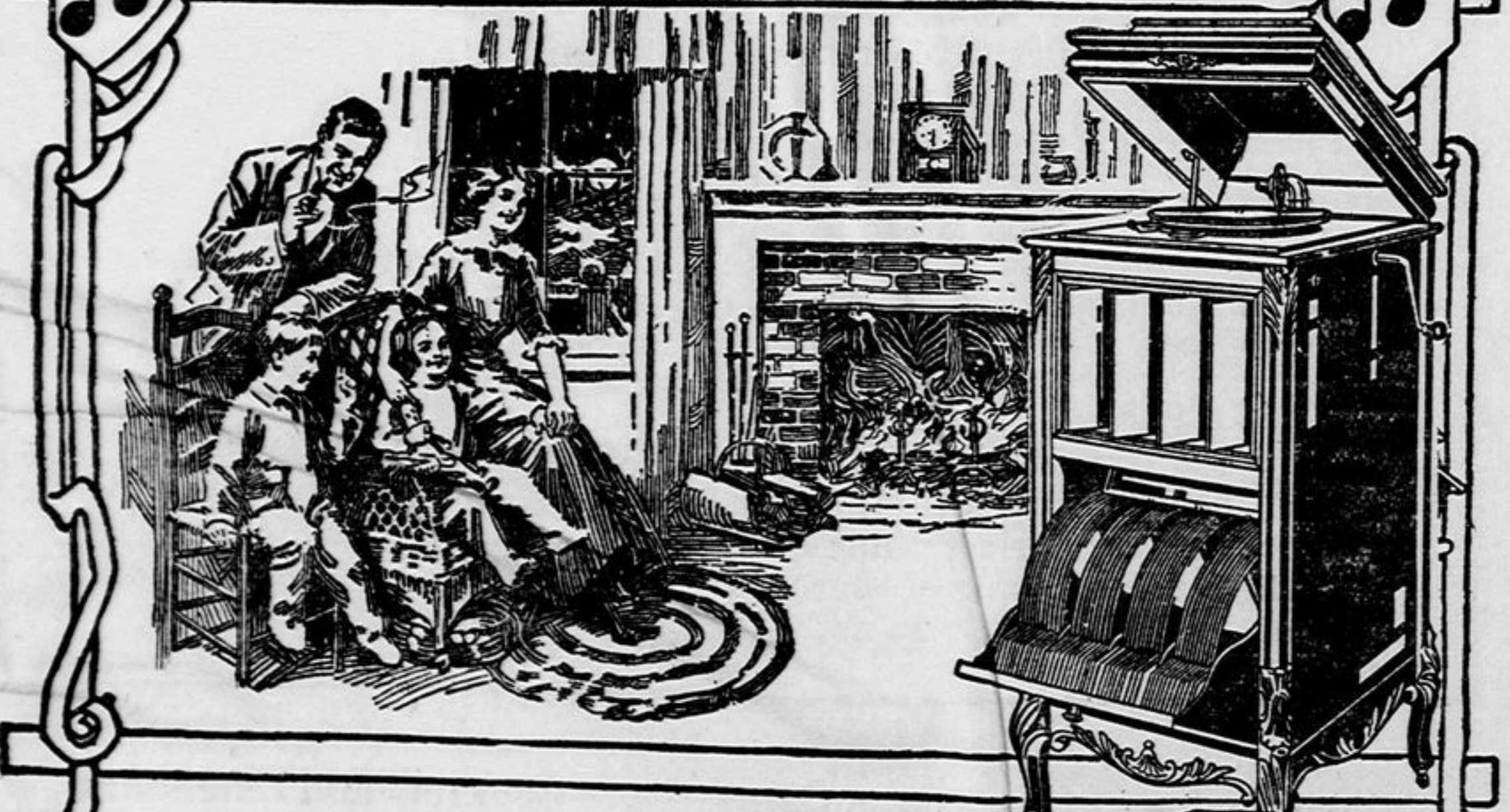

### BY-LAW NO. 683 of the Municipality of the Town of Durham.

A By-law for the payment of the balance of \$1,000.00 remaining due on the erection and construction of a High School in the Town of Durham, and to authorize the issue of debentures of the said Town of Durham, to the amount of \$1,000.00 for the purpose aforesaid:

Whereas by By-law Number 539 of the Municipal Corporation of the Town of Durham, dated the 5th day of July, 1915, it was enacted that the said Municipal Corporation should borrow the sum of \$15,000.00, and issue debentures of the said Corporation to the said amount to provide for the purchase of land for a site, for and for the erection and construction of a High School in the Town of Durham.

And Whereas the purchase of land for a site, and the erection and construction of a High School thereon has been duly completed, and the cost of such purchase, erection and construction, has been found to exceed the original estimated cost thereof by the sum of \$1,000.00 or thereabout, and in order to provide for payment of such excess, it will be necessary to issue debentures of the said Town of Durham, for the sum of \$1,000.00 as hereinafter provided (which is the debt intended to be created by this By-law), the proceeds of the said debentures to be applied to the purpose aforesaid, and to no other

And Whereas it is desirable to issue the said debentures at one time and to make the principal of the said debt repayable by yearly installments during the period of ten years, being the currency of the said debentures, said yearly sums being of such respective amounts that the aggregate amount payable in each year for principal and interest, in respect of said debentures shall be as nearly as possible equal to the amount so payable in each of the other nine years of said period (as shewn in Schedule "A" hereto annexed)

And Whereas the total amount required by "The Municipal Act" to be raised annually by special rate for paying the said debt and interest as hereinafter provided is the sum of \$135.87.

And Whereas the amount of the whole rateable property of the Town of Durham, according to the last revised assessment roll thereof is the sum of \$624,670.00.

And Whereas the amount of the existing debenture debt of the said Municipality, exclusive of local improvement debts secured by special rates or assessments by the sum of \$62,363.59 whereof no part of the principal or interest is in arrears.

Therefore the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Durham enacts as follows:

1. The Municipal Council of the Town of Durham shall expend the sum of \$1,000.00 in payment of the balance remaining due on the erection and construction of a High School building in the Town of Durham, and for the purpose of raising the said sum, debentures of the said Town of Durham to the amount of \$1,000.00 as aforesaid, shall be issued each of which debentures shall be dated on the date of issue thereof, and shall be payable within ten years thereafter, at the office of the Standard Bank of Canada, at the said Town of Durham.

2. Each of the said debentures shall be signed by the Mayor of the said Town of Durham, and by the Treasurer thereof, and the Clerk of the said Town of Durham shall attach thereto the Corporate Seal of the said Municipality.

3. The said debentures shall bear interest at the rate of six per centum per annum, payable yearly at the office of the Standard Bank of Canada at the said Town of Durham, and shall have attached thereto, coupons for payment of the said interest, which coupons shall be signed by the Mayor and Treasurer of the said Town of Durham.

4. During the currency of the said debentures there shall be raised annually by special rate on all rateable property in the Town of Durham the sum of \$135.87 for the purpose of paying the amount due in each of the years for principal and interest in respect of the said debentures (as shewn in Schedule "A" hereto annexed).

5. This By-law shall take effect on and from the final passing thereof by the Municipal Council of the Town of Durham.

6. The Votes of the electors of the said Town of Durham shall be taken on this By-law at the following times and places, that is to say:—

On Monday the 1st day of January A. D. 1917, commencing at the hour of nine o'clock in the forenoon and continuing until five o'clock in the afternoon of the same day by the following Deputy Returning Officers and Poll Clerks:

In North Ward at George Shier's store, by Clifton Elvidge, Deputy Returning Officer, Joseph Firth, Senior, Poll Clerk.

In East Ward at W. H. Bean's store, by W. H. Bean, Deputy Returning Officer, W. P. Paterson, Poll Clerk.

In West Ward, at the Town Hall by John Smith, Deputy Returning Officer, George Kress, Poll Clerk.

7. On Saturday, the 30th day

of December, A.D. 1916, the Mayor of the said Town of Durham shall attend at the Clerk's office at the said Town of Durham at the hour of 10 o'clock in the forenoon to appoint persons to attend at the several polling places aforesaid, and at the final summing up of the votes by the Clerk on behalf of the persons interested in and promoting or opposing the passing of this By-law respectively.

8. The Clerk of the Council of the said Town of Durham shall attend at his office in the said Town of Durham at 10 o'clock in the forenoon of Tuesday, the 2nd day of January, A.D. 1917, to sum up the number of votes for and against this By-law.

### BY-LAW NO. 684 of the Municipality of the Town of Durham.

BY-LAW No. — of the mun cor e A By-law to authorize the borrowing of the sum of \$5,000.00 by the issue and sale of debentures, to provide funds for the payment of the balance remaining due on the purchase and installation of the electric light and power plant in the Town of Durham

Whereas by By-law Number 654 of the Town of Durham, dated the 19th day of July, 1915, it was enacted that the said Municipal Corporation should borrow the sum of \$13,000.00, and issue debentures of the said Corporation to the said amount to provide for the purchase of the Electric Lighting Plant then existing, and also for the cost of a plant to distribute Electric Power by the Hydro-Electric Power Commission of Ontario in the Town of Durham.

And Whereas the then existing Electric Lighting Plant has been purchased, and the Plant to distribute Electric Power by the Hydro-Electric Power Commission of Ontario has been duly installed in the said Town of Durham, and the cost of such purchase and installation has been found to exceed the original estimated cost by the sum of \$5,000.00, or thereabout; and in order to meet such excess, it will be necessary to issue debentures of the said Town of Durham for the sum of \$5,000.00 as hereinafter provided (which is the debt intended to be created by this By-law), the proceeds of the said debentures to be applied to the purpose aforesaid, and to no other.

And Whereas it is desirable to issue the said debentures at one time and to make the principal of the said debt repayable by yearly installments during the period of twenty years, being the currency of the said debentures, said yearly sums being of such respective amounts that the aggregate amount payable in each year for principal and interest, in respect of the said debt shall be as nearly as possible equal to the amount so payable in each of the other nineteen years of said period (as shewn in Schedule "A" hereto annexed)

And Whereas the total amount required by "The Municipal Act" to be raised annually by special rate for paying the said debt and interest as hereinafter provided is the sum of \$435.92.

And Whereas the amount of the whole rateable property of the Town of Durham, according to the last revised assessment roll thereof is the sum of \$624,670.00.

And Whereas the amount of the existing debenture debt of the said Municipality, exclusive of local improvement debts secured by special rates or assessments is the sum of \$62,363.59 whereof no part of the principal or interest is in arrears.

Therefore the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Durham enacts as follows:

3.
