British Trench Raids. The official report from British Headquarters in France issued Sunday night reads: "Last night a party of our troops successfully raided the enemy's trenches near Ransart, inflicting a number of casualties and bombing his dug-outs. We also entered the enemy's trenches southwest of Wytschaete, where we destroyed machine gun emplacements."

Huns Lose Four Millions. The total German casualties, excluding those in the naval and colonial service, reported in the German official statement, was 166,176 officers and men, for November, making the total German losses in killed, wounded and missing since the war broke out 3,921,860.

TRIUMPH AT VERDUN ANSWER TO HOLLWEG

French Took 11,387 Prisoners and Many Guns North of Douaumont—Totals Grow. London despatches on Tuesday said: French troops have regained the entire occupancy of the Chambrettes Farm, northeast of Verdun and about the centre of their advance of last week. Prisoners taken in the latest French thrust on the Verdun front now total 11,387, including 284 officers, in addition to 115 cannon and 107 machine guns captured or destroyed.

BRITISH ATTACK KUT. Carefully-prepared Offensive Meets With Sudden Success. A London despatch on Monday said: The British army on the Tigris front, which assumed the offensive last Wednesday, has made a further advance. An official statement given out here yesterday says the British are now within three-quarters of a mile of the Tigris opposite Kut-el-Amara.

GIVE FRANCE RAILWAYS. Thousand Miles of Canadian Track to be Torn Up. Canada has undertaken to supply, largely from its own excess railway mileage, at least one thousand miles of rails and other track material for immediate use in France.
