SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

The sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions. Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may preempt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$30 per acre. Duties—Six months' residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain Districts. Price \$30 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$300.

BRITISH GAIN IN WEST AT TWO POINTS

British Capture and Hold Gonnelle—French Make Further Progress North of the Aisne

The British troops fighting in France have made additional gains between Arras and St. Quentin and also south-east of Loos, in the latter district taking prisoners. The British official reports follow: Sunday evening—Our troops have made further progress east of the Havrincourt wood and have carried the southern portion of Trescaut village. Smart fighting occurred throughout the day south-east of Loos. We gained further ground in this area and captured some prisoners. There was considerable activity in the air yesterday and much fighting, in which four German machines were brought down and six driven down out of control. In addition a hostile machine was brought down by our anti-aircraft guns. Four of our aeroplanes are missing. Hurl Enemy Back Saturday Night—To-day the enemy made an unsuccessful attempt to recover the village of Gonnelle, captured last night. His attacking troops, caught by our artillery fire, were driven back, leaving many dead in front of our position. We gained ground during the day by local fighting along the north bank of the Scarpe, eastward of Fampoux, and advanced our lines slightly north-west of Lens. In this latter area two other German counter-attacks were successfully beaten off. During the night a small party of the enemy raided one of our crater posts south of Ypres. A few of our men are missing. Saturday Morning—We captured the village of Gonnelle last night after sharp fighting, taking also a number of prisoners. An enemy party attempted to enter our trenches in the neighborhood of Fauquissart, but was repulsed. Artillery fire continued on both sides at a number of places during the night.

French Win in Many Places The official communication issued by the French war office reads:—"Sunday—Between the Somme and the Oise very active artillery fighting took place during the course of the day south of St. Quentin and north of Urvillers. Between Soissons and Rheims the artillery actions were intermittent in various sectors. "The text of the statement reads:—"In the region south of St. Quentin the artillery bombardment continued rather violent during the night. Between the Aisne and the Chemin des Dames we made new progress to the north of Sancy and Jouy. "Violent Artillery Duels "Between the Somme and the Oise violent artillery duels occurred, especially in the region south of St. Quentin. Between the Aisne and the Chemin des Dames we continued our progress on the plateau north of Sancy. Grenade fighting enabled us to gain ground in the sector of Hurbise. Our barrage fire broke down four different attempts made by the enemy to debouch from trenches north of Braye-en-Laonnois. In the region of Rheims, in Champagne, there was intermittent artillery fighting, quite spirited at certain points."

Canada's Latent Wealth Research Council will Investigate Mineral Wealth An Ottawa report on Monday said: The honorary advisory council for scientific and industrial research has received reports on many subjects under investigation. Among these are the problems of "the manufacture of nitrogenous fertilizers," "the production of potash from feldspar, and other raw materials by various processes," "the utilization of the tar sands of the Athabasca region," "the manufacture of oil and other products from oil shales," and "the smelting of iron from iron ores mined in the Dominion" in order to substitute these so far as possible for the ores now imported for different purposes. At present no less than 83 per cent. of all the iron ore smelted in the Dominion is imported from foreign countries.

Krupp Workers Strike German Munition Factories Seriously Handicapped Amsterdam reports: Advice from the frontier state that a strike has broken out at Essen in the Krupp Works. The message sent out from Berlin saying that the strike there was ended is now admitted to have anticipated that event. Though a majority have returned to work, numbers remained away, to such an extent that the work of the munition factories was most seriously handicapped. According to The Vorwarts, the workers of the Deutschewaffen and Munitions Fabriken decided to continue the strike. These number about 25,000. The concern is one of the largest in Germany, and controls the Mauser Works.

20,000 Prussian Dead A report from French Headquarters says: More than twenty thousand Prussian dead lie on the hills and plateaus north of the Aisne, for the fatalities in this new "slaughterhouse of Verdun," in proportion to the length of the battle, greatly exceed the numbers of the Prussians who fell on the banks of the Meuse. The French had by Monday counted more than twenty-five thousand prisoners, and the wounded are roughly estimated at nearly twice that number.

Abandon Drive on Italy A Rome despatch on Sunday said: The big Franco-British offensive has so disrupted von Hindenburg's plans that the contemplated offensive against Italy has been abandoned. Italy is thus free to undertake an offensive of her own, in co-operation with the British and French.

\$10,000,000 Shipping Loan The Imperial Munitions Board has accepted the offer of Sir Thomas White to make a special loan of ten million dollars to assist in the development of wooden ship building in Canada.
