

FOR PERIOD OF THE WAR

At a special meeting of Hanover council on the 15th inst., the following resolutions were passed by the Hanover council:

"That whereas about twenty-five million dollars are spent annually in connection with horse races. Whereas all race courses have been closed in England for the period of the war, and in many of the states of the Union horse-racing is prohibited. Whereas the present shortage of food is so serious that every town, village and township are organizing to speed up production and prevent waste. Whereas, the race track is an economic waste as well as a moral burden. Therefore, be it resolved that in the opinion of this council horse racing should not be permitted in Canada during the period of the war and that we urge our representative in
