FORMER ONTARIO MAN NOW LORD MAYER OF LONDON.

London, Sept. 29.—Chas. A. Hansen, alderman of London and member of Parliament for the south-east division of Cornwall, was elected lord mayor of London to-day. He will succeed Sir William Henry Dunn.

Mayor Hansen is a former London, Ontario man. His father was formerly a Methodist minister in the London Conference about 40 years ago.

MANY CANADIANS BECOMING AMERICAN CITIZENS.

Detroit, Sept. 30.—It is estimated by an official in the office of the Wayne county clerk here that at least one-half of the men applying for naturalization papers in the circuit court during the week just closed are of Canadian birth. Two hundred and forty-four Canadians were admitted to full American citizenship, while approximately 200 more applications were not acted upon.
