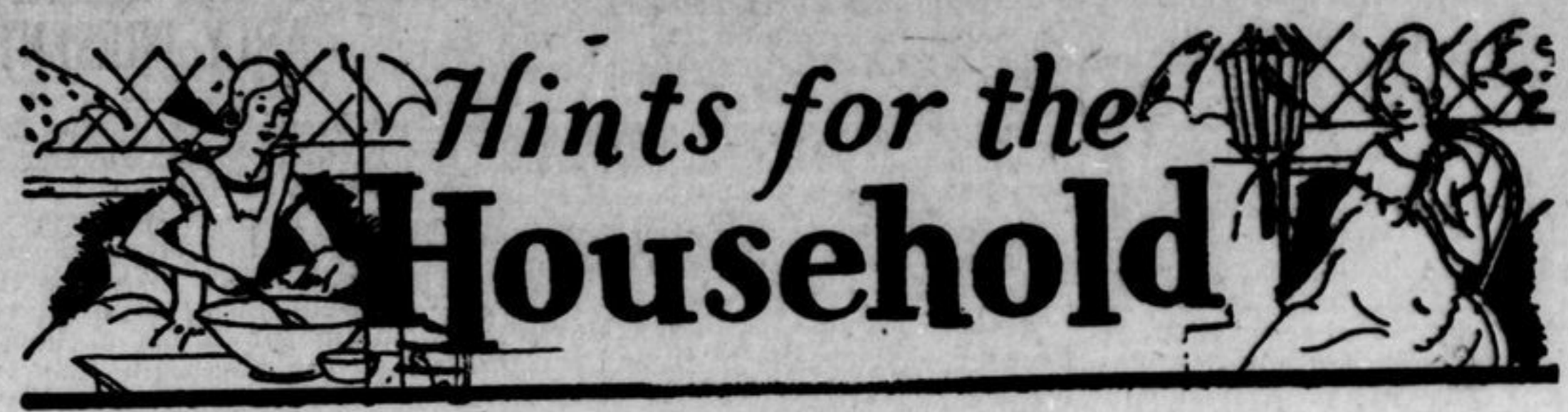

THINGS WORTH KNOWING

To Set a Table for a Luncheon

- 1. A luncheon cloth or doilies should be used.
2. Allow about 24 inches for each plate.
3. Service plates mark the centre of the place.
4. Put knife, cutting edge to the plate, at right of place. Spoons go next to it.
5. Put fork, tines up, to left of plate, also salad or pie forks.
6. The order to take your silver is from the outside towards the plate. The spreader across it, is placed at tip of knife.
8. The bread and butter plate with the spreader across it, is placed at top of fork.
9. A folded napkin has its open edge to the plate.

To Clean Baby's Bottle

If a baby's bottle is allowed to stand any length of time before being washed, it becomes very messy and dangerously sour. This is true of cow's milk. I have found a very easy way to always have baby's bottle sweet.

COOKING HINTS

Spinach Rings With Mushrooms

- 1 peck spinach.
1 cup milk or cream.
This amount serves about 3.
1 tablespoon butter.
1 tablespoon flour.
Seasoning.
3 eggs.
Mushrooms.
Method: Cook spinach—cut up and strain. Make a white sauce by melting butter, adding flour and seasoning and milk. Stir beaten yolks of eggs slowly into white sauce. Mix with spinach. When cool, fold in stiffly beaten whites of eggs. Put in greased ring mold or cake pan. Set in pan of water and bake. If ring is used—insert on platter, fill center with broiled, buttered mushrooms.
If pan is used, shape tablespoons of spinach as necessary. Put on platter and in middle, place buttered, broiled mushrooms. Canned spinach can be used. Very pretty for luncheon.

Frozen Fruit Salad

- 1 orange.
1/4 grape fruit.
1 can pineapple (strained).
1 can white cherries (strained).
1 can pears (strained).
1 can peaches (strained).
Method: cut up fruit. Mix the fruit and fruit juices with juice of 1 lemon and 1 pint of mayonnaise dressing. Beat 1 bottle whipping

cream stiff and add to fruit dressing mixture. Freeze. Remove dasher. Repack in a mold. Serve as a dessert with cake. Serve as a salad with crackers. This amount serves about 3 dozen.

Baked Pork Chops

Pork Chops. Cooked rice or mashed potatoes. Fresh tomato. Onion. Green pepper. Method: Have pork chops cut thin. Place pork chops in baking pan. On top of pork chops, put layer cooked rice or potato. On top of this a slice of tomato. On top of this, a green pepper. Season each layer with salt and pepper. Pour a little hot water in pan. Bake 1 hour in a moderate oven.

Browned Onions

Peel and parboil onions of uniform size. Cook about 20 minutes in salt water; drain. Add to meat—same as for browned potatoes.

BAKING HINTS

- Rules For Baking Powder
1. Mix and sift all dry ingredients together.
2. Use 2 teaspoons baking powder to 1 cup of flour.
3. Sift flour before it is measured.
4. Grease pans or muffin tins before mixture is ready.
6. Bake mixtures immediately when ready.

LOCAL PRODUCE PRICES KEEP UP WELL

Durham Buyers Giving Full Value For All Farm Produce, According to Montreal Prices.

The supplies of new laid eggs reaching Durham are slowly increasing, but with continued cold and stormy weather, the price will hold firm. Quite a number of small pullets' eggs are coming in, and these have to be bought at a price equal to that being paid for seconds.

Creameries have dropped the price of butter fat to around 33 cents owing to the markets showing a decline in the price of creamery butter. Finest pasteurized creamery prints sold in Montreal on Saturday at a price of 33 cents, while fadder made creamery sold at from 31 to 32 1/2 cents per pound.

For the first two weeks in January, the market for live poultry held strong in Buffalo but declined at the end of last week owing to very liberal supplies and a slow demand. There is an embargo from 8 states prohibiting the shipping of live fowl over their borders owing to the poultry plague which has been so prevalent in some parts and which has already cost a loss of thousands of valuable birds in these different states of the U.S.A.

LADY WILLISON DEAD AFTER BRIEF ILLNESS

Prominent in Toronto Women's Organizations.—Regret Is Widespread.

In the sudden passing Monday of Lady Willison at her home at 10 Elmley Place after a brief illness, Toronto loses one of its outstanding women. Lady Willison was for twelve years president of the Ladies' Guild of the British and Foreign Sailors' Society, and a prominent member of the Daughters of the Empire, of the Toronto Ladies' Club and the Toronto Hunt, and always took an active part in the Canadian Authors' Association, of which Sir John Willison was formerly the Toronto president.

The death of Lady Willison followed an illness of a week. She had contracted a severe cold, which developed into pneumonia and resulted fatally in spite of all the efforts of Dr. W. B. Thistle, the family physician. The late Lady Willison was born in Tiverton, Bruce County, and before her marriage was Miss Rachel Wood Turner. She was married in June, 1885. There were two sons, William, who was engaged in newspaper work when the war broke out and enlisted and made the supreme sacrifice overseas, and Walter A. Willison, now of Toronto, also formerly in newspaper work, and who

served for a time as a war correspondent.

Many expressions of deep regret at the passing of one who took such an active interest in the life of the community and did so many good works by which she is remembered, have been received by the bereaved family. A heartfelt tribute was paid to her memory by Mrs. Alfred Hall, widow of the late Dr. Alfred Hall, who founded the Ladies' Guild of the British and Foreign Sailors' Society.

Lady Willison is survived by her husband, Sir John Willison, and her son. The funeral service, which was private, was conducted by Canon Cody, a close friend of the family and held on Wednesday afternoon. Interment was made in Mount Pleasant cemetery. Lady Willison was a sister of Mrs. T. A. Harris, for many years a resident of Durham but no residing in Toronto.
