They also presented her with a pin, the insignia of her new office. After the ceremony, she gladly posed for this picture.

## More Than a Half Ton Cheese

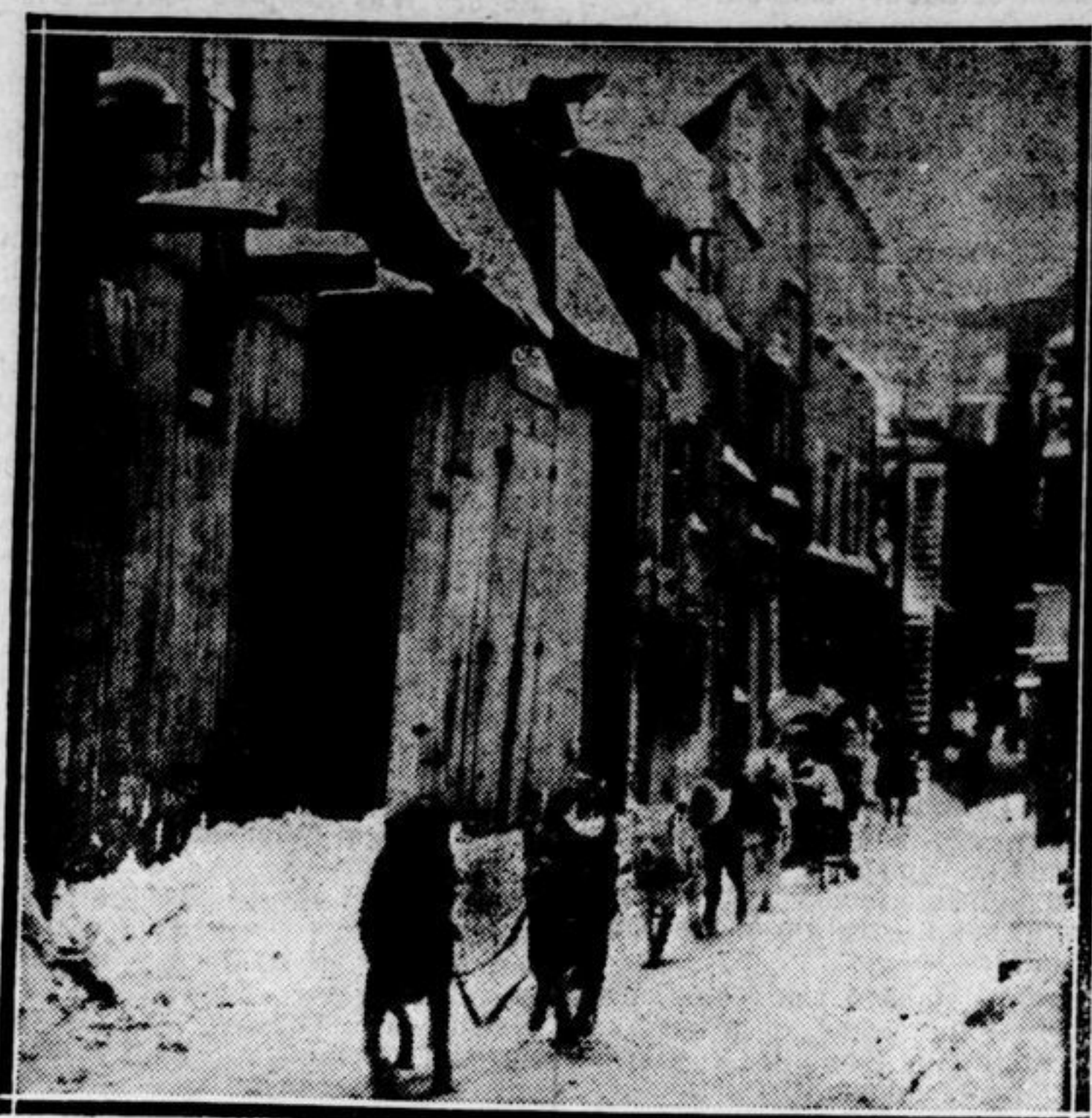

THIS beautiful statue of Abraham Lincoln, which stands in the courthouse square at Newark, N.J., is acknowledged as one of the best likenesses ever made of the famous martyred president whose birthday occurs this month. It is the work of Gutzon Borglum, the same famous sculptor who is at present engaged in the enormous task of carving a great Confederate Memorial scene in the side of Stone Mountain near Atlanta, Ga. The figure you see posing alongside of the above statue is George Billings, the screen star, who bears a natural physical likeness to the great Civil War President. Mr. Billings has made a keen study of Lincoln's life and is soon to appear in a film version of "The Dramatic Life of Abraham Lincoln."
