The picture shows a test being made of the vest which is the product of a New York corporation. Its makers are of the opinion that it should be worn by all men whose duty is to protect life and property. They cite the fact that one policeman and an average of 27 people come to an untimely end daily in the United States through bullets. The vest consists of layers of "Bovite" .013 of an inch thick. It is covered with the same thickness of metallized graphitic material which causes a bullet to side-slip without ricrochetting. It will resist every type of re-volver or pistol bullet, both the lead and metal-jacketted.
