To Truck Owners and Drivers

Provisions against overloading at this season provided by The Highways Act will be rigorously enforced. Avoid penalty by obeying the law.

To save the highways from unnecessary damage during the wet spring months when foundations are easily fractured and road surfaces broken, The Highways Act provides that during March and April trucks (outside cities and towns)

"shall not be loaded in excess of one-half the carrying capacity of such vehicle as registered with the Department, without obtaining a permit as provided in Section 31."

The attention of every truck owner and driver is called specifically to this provision. In their own interest the Department urges their co-operation in obeying the law. In view of this public statement of the law, they are notified that rigorous prosecution will follow neglect or refusal to do so.

While the whole of the people of Ontario have contributed to the building of highways in the past, it may be expected that the cost of repairs and maintenance will fall more and more on those who use the roads. The traffic which does most damage, naturally will be expected to pay most.

Therefore, it is in the interest of every truck ownner and driver to see that his loads and speeds are kept well within the legal limit at this season of the
