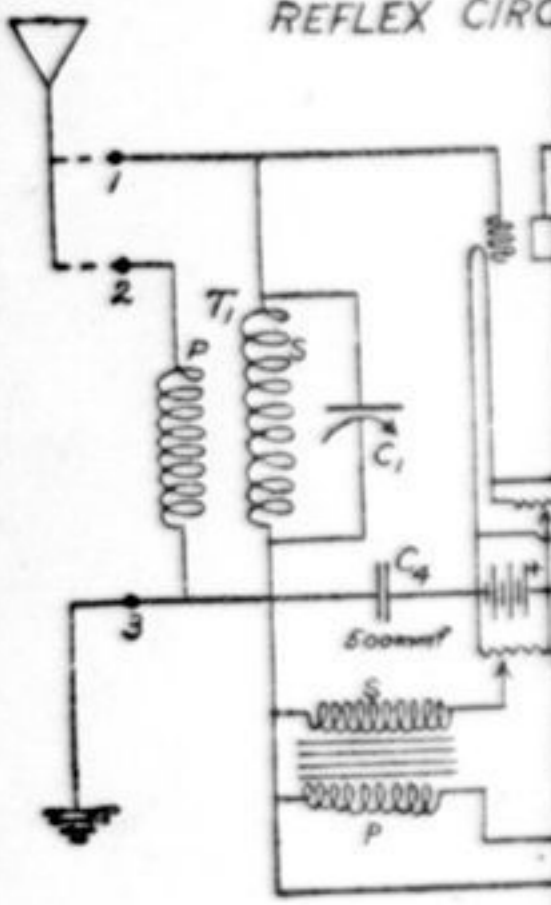

REFLEX CIRCUIT



For the sake of room, of simplicity, we must have to some extent an automatic reflex circuit makes it ideal use in a portable set. The diagram shows a suitable 2 tube reflex circuit with a crystal detector.

The tuning transformer and reflex transformer may be made; the other apparatus is listed below:

- 500 mhf. variable cond. (about 23 plate)
1 Filament rheostat.
1 200 ohm potentiometer.
2 A. F. Transformers.
1 Brownie Crystal Detector
2 500 mhf. by-pass condenser
1 2000 mhf. by-pass condenser
2 Diodes.
1 (45 to 90 volts) B battery
