"Cold Cash" For A Cold Trip



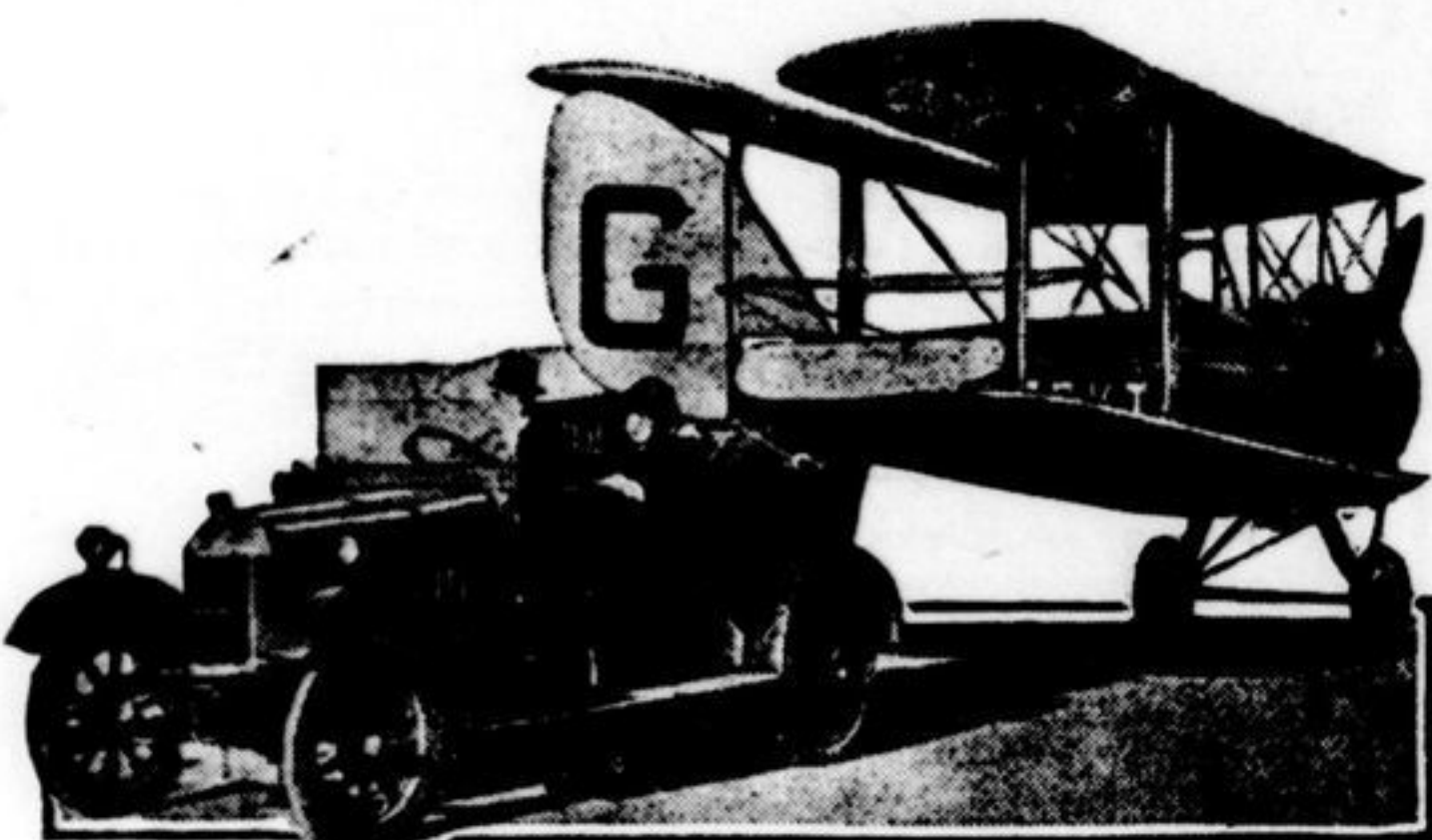

How's This For "Fishin' Luck?"



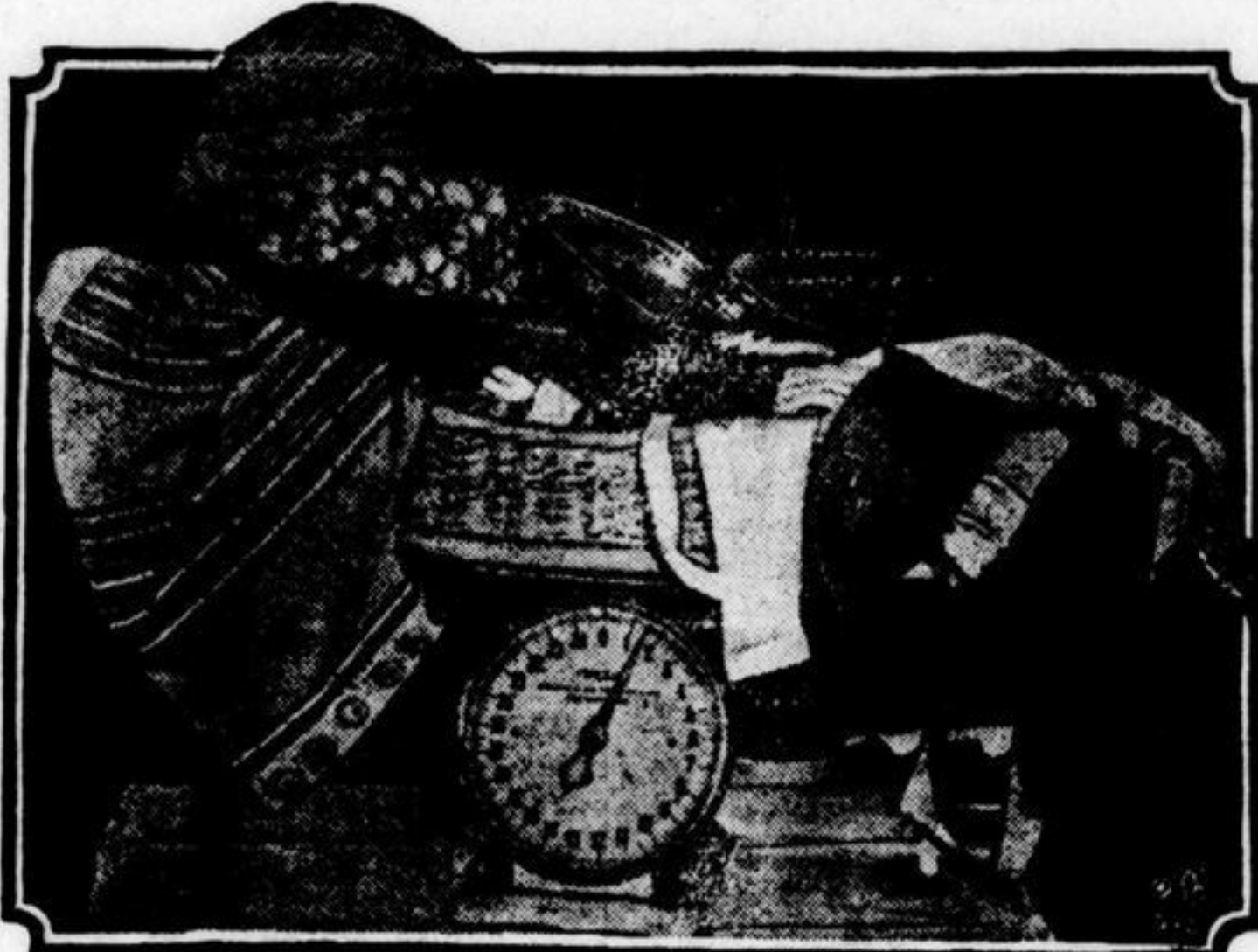

Played Country Lass Roles Once--And Now Look!



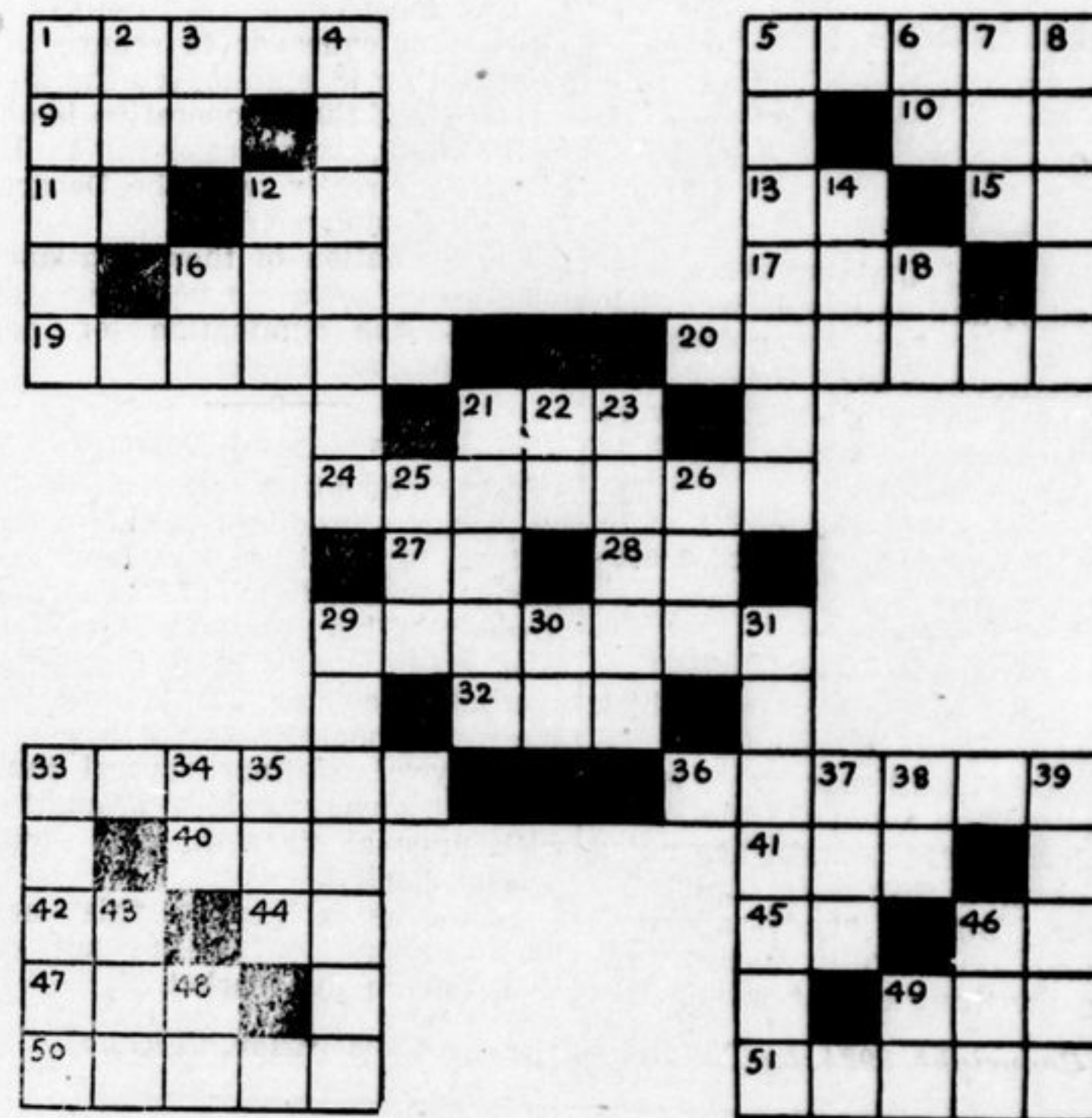

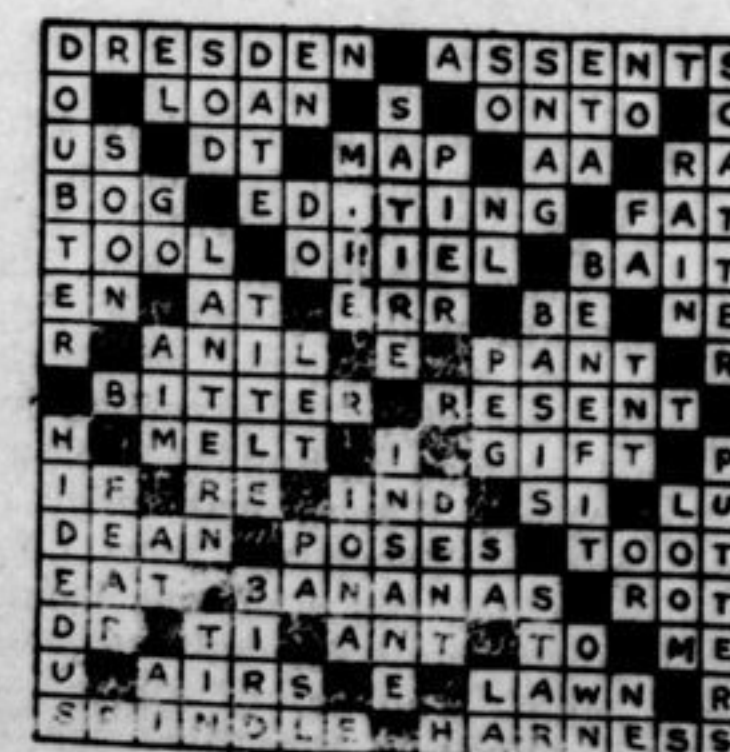
