TUNGSTEN

The compounds of tungsten are unusually heavy, and from this fact, it gets its name, meaning "heavy stone." It is never found free in nature, and the ores from which it is commercially obtained are wolfram, ferberite and scheelite.

Tungsten is a heavy, infusible metal, only slowly attacked by any single acid, and not sensibly tarnished in air. Hammering and rolling renders the tungsten ductile; the work is carried on in ingenious machines, at a temperature of 1200 to 1400 degrees C. About fifty successive treatments in this machine are necessary to reduce the diameter of the bar from 6 to 1 millimeter. This hammering and rolling is the secret of ductile tungsten which is used for filaments in incandescent lamps.

FEEDING LAYING PULLETS

Especially good results were obtained from alfalfa leaves in an experiment conducted at the Brandon Experimental Farm to determine value of different supplements fed in conjunction with the ration. Alfalfa leaves fed in open rack kept before pullets proously, manzolds split and fresh each day, and canner's cooked and mixed with mash, the supplements used. During the days of the experiment, the given alfalfa leaves laid an average of 22.9 laid by those meat and 20.1 by those given leaf. The alfalfa leaves gave, therefore, the greatest profit over feed, and in this test were found to be worth 10.8 cents per bushel as a winter feed for laying pullets.
