IT IS ONE OF THE MOST PRECIOUS AND GLORIOUS truths of the Christian Gospel that when Jesus Christ comes into the life, old things pass away, and all things become new. This does not only mean that old sins are forgiven and old habits that enslaved are overcome, but by the inworking of the Holy Spirit, the mind is renewed and transformed, the whole mental outlook on life is changed, and human affairs and their ultimate outcome are viewed in the light of God's own Holy truth.

These reflections are inspired by a reading of "Some Modern Problems," by Christabel Pankhurst. It is not so many years since Miss Pankhurst gained world-wide fame, or perhaps notoriety would be a better word, as the great protagonist of women's suffrage. A few years ago Christ entered her life, and she started to study human problems in the light of human sin and the redemption of Christ. Now she sees the days of the suffrage campaign as the "days of political childhood." Her own large anticipations she describes as based on ignorance, and she who once preached "Votes for Women" as the certain panacea for the ills of the world, now proclaims will all her heart and soul and mind and strength, Jesus Christ and Him crucified as the only hope of the nations and His glorious return as the one great event that can give to the warring earth peace and establish lasting righteousness among men.

THE YEAR BOOK OF THE YOUNG MEN'S CHRISTIAN Association for 1925 deals with the American dollar and how it is spent. According to *The American Education Digest*, here is the accounting:

Living costs	24½ cents
Luxuries	22 cents
Waste	14 cents
Miscellaneous	13½ cents
Investment	11 cents
Crime	8½ cents
Government	4½ cents
Schools	1½ cents
Church	0¾ cents

From these figures the compiler of the Year Book draws the deductions that the people of the United States:

1. Spend nearly as much for luxuries as for living costs.
2. Spend one-half as much for investment as for luxuries.
3. Waste more than one-half as much as it costs to live.
4. Spend only one-fifteenth as much for school and education as for luxuries.
5. Waste nine times as much as they spend on school and education.
6. Spend six times as much for crime and its punishment as for school and education.
7. Spend twice as much for school and education as for church and religious interests.
8. Spend eleven times as much on crime and its punishment as on church and religious interests.
9. Waste \$19 for every \$1 they spend on church and religious interests.
10. Spend \$29 on luxuries for every \$1 given to church and religious interests.

If our Christian people could be made to realize what these figures mean, and to set resolutely toward making a change in them for the better, then certainly the 48,224,000 church members gathered in the 237,945 churches in our country should have influence and power enough to start something worth while.

THERE IS NO BOOK IN THE WORLD THAT HAS BEEN handed down as has the Bible, and we today study every consonant of the Bible. There are 29 kings of Egypt, Israel, Judah, Moab, Damascus, Tyre, Babylon, Assyria, Persia; ten different countries mentioned among these 29 both in the Bible and on the monuments, so we can trace them. Every one of these is mentioned in the Bible as king of the right country. Every one of the 29 is mentioned in the correct chronological and synchronous order. Remember, some of these kings reigned, like Rameses II., for 62 years, some for two months. If you were going to write the history of this century, and had to get those little kings in the Balkans and Germany and Austria and Italy down right in the synchronism and in their relativity, you would find a big problem. Stratford Police Chief Real Samaritan

Pool Room Condition Unsatisfactory

The Warton Town Councilors were addressed on Monday night, January 25, by a local resident whose boy had just this week been implicated before the Police Magistrate and been suspended for sentence for a year. The gentleman complained against one of the local poolrooms. He claimed that instead of being a place of recreation for the men of the town, it was a den of iniquity and a standing menace to the morals of the youth of the community. Boys under age were allowed to frequent the place, and there heard all kinds of profanity. The place was dirty. It was counteracting the influence of the home and the church in the community with the young people, and as it was under control of the Council, the man should either lose his license, or be made to keep it in a place, or else the police should keep in very close touch of the place and see that it was properly regulated as a place of recreation. He charged this place with being largely responsible for his boy going astray. The result of this complaint has been a letter from the Mayor being sent this week to the proprietor warning him to set his house in order and to keep it so or he will find himself out of the pool room business.—*Warton Canadian Echo.*

Disastrous Fire Near Listowel

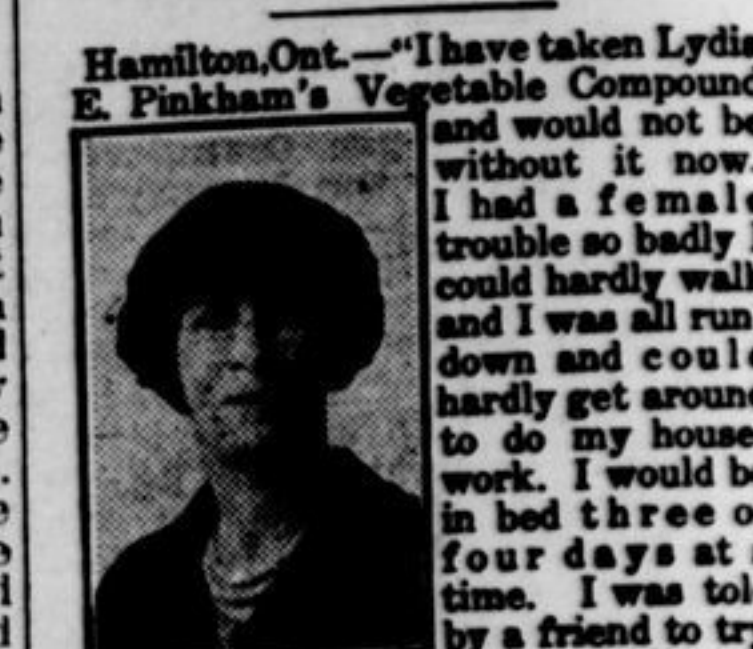
One of the most disastrous fires that have occurred in this district for a long time took place on Tuesday evening last, when the large barn belonging to Mr. Thomas Gibson, boundary east, was completely destroyed almost to the contents. The fire broke out about 8:30 p.m. and was first noticed by Mr. W. Kritzer. All the members of Mr. Gibson's family except Mr. and Mrs. Gibson had retired for the evening, and the first intimation they had of the fire was when Mr. Kritzer phoned them.

The barn was soon a roaring furnace, and although every effort was made to get the stock out, a great portion of it was destroyed. All the horses and 16 cows were saved, but 16 fat calves and yearlings, 12 pigs and about 150 hens were destroyed.
