THORNBURY HAS POST OFFICE SCANDAL

Sensational Developments Expected in Post Office Clean-up Shortly Caused by Posting of Indecent Letters.—Meaford Has a Thrill, Too.

According to The Thornbury Review-Herald, astounding and startling revelations of a most serious nature which involves the names of a number of Thornbury residents will, in all probability, be disclosed in the near future.

For the past four years, an underhand campaign of indecent letter writing has been going on through the Thornbury post office against certain respectable citizens of the town which is to be checked by the intervention of the postal authorities. Postmaster Ferguson of the village states that the latter have closely kept in touch with the situation, and with the aid of handwriting experts are ready to begin definite proceedings.

That such a thing has been going on, of course, comes as a shock to the district, and it is alleged that about fifty letters have come from the one source, addressed to several persons in the town. These are now in the hands of the officials. It is not known how many more have been sent out. Some of the letters are written in the most obscene, indecent and scurrilous language possible, and are very defamatory in character.

The case, according to The Review-Herald, "resembles in many instances, the recent Durham case which caused considerable excitement in Grey County. Mr. Ferguson, who was on the jury in that case, states the letters in the present case are even more unseemly and indecent than the other."

Being on the grand jury in the Durham case, Postmaster Ferguson of Thornbury should know, and as the letters in the local case had about every brand of filth known, it must be admitted that those in the Thornbury episode must be right pert epistles. The jury will probably have to get a shovel or a pair of tongs to handle them.

Meaford, too, according to The Mirror, also had a case on its hands, though not of so glaring a nature, the most serious charges being minor improprieties of conduct.

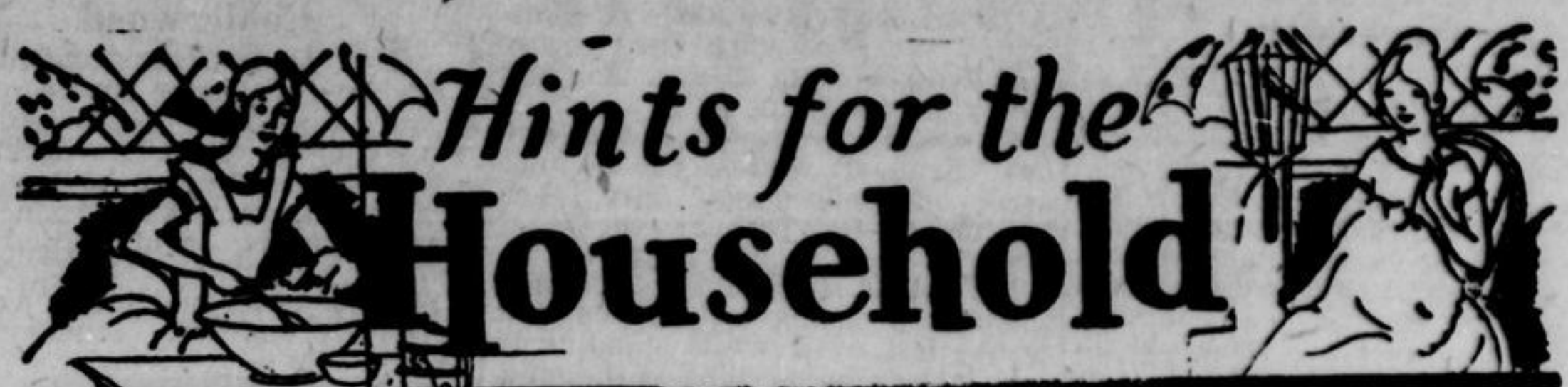

Hints for the Household

HOUSEHOLD HINTS

Here are a few rules for successful cake baking: When you once make a successful cake then Use same recipe Use recipe accurately. Use same brands of ingredients. And last but not least, do not take too long mixing the ingredients. In order to do this have everything ready beforehand so that materials can be blended rapidly.

House Cleaning Hints

When painting or washing moldings, hold a heavy piece of cardboard under the molding so that the paint or water that drops from brush or rag will not spatter on the wall.

Apartment Sewing Hint

When it is necessary to use your dining-room table to cut on, you will find it practical to keep your asbestos pad or silence cloth on the table while cutting. This will keep the top of your table from being scratched or marred.

COOKING HINTS

Asparagus Short Cake Method: Cook asparagus. Make your favorite biscuit recipe.

Make a white sauce. Cook several eggs hard boiled. Then when ready to serve split and butter the biscuits or large sort cake. Lay asparagus between halves. Mix white of egg in white sauce. Pour white sauce over asparagus and biscuit. Top with the powdered yolk of egg.

Angel Cake Desserts

1. Method: Cut angel cake in slices. One slice to each plate. Cover each slice with whipped cream. Place a half of a canned peach in the centre of each piece. Turn hollow down—having filled it with chopped dates.

This is different and pretty and resembles a poached egg. 2. Take any fresh fruit. Cut up a little (do not crush). Mix well with whipped cream. Sweeten. Fill center of angel food cake with this mixture. Place in ice box and chill. Serve on a platter and top with whipped cream and pieces of fruit. 3. Cut angel food in squares. Cover with frosting made of powdered sugar. Roll in chopped pecans.

BAKING HINTS

Oat Meal Kisses 1 cup of rolled oats.

1/2 cup of shredded cocoanut. Little salt. 1/2 cup of brown sugar. 1 egg (beaten). Flavoring. 1/2 tablespoon of melted butter. Method: Mix in order given. Bake big teaspoonfuls on a greased and floured cookie pan.

Baked Rice With Cheese

This is nice to serve at a simple luncheon as an accompaniment to a salad. 1 cup of rice. Salt. Butter. Cheese. Seasonings. Milk. Method: Steam rice. Grease a baking dish. Put in a layer of cooked rice. Then season and cover with pieces of butter and cheese. Alternate until dish is nearly full. Pour over milk to two-thirds depth of dish. Dot top with butter and cheese and bake until rice is thoroughly hot and cheese is melted.

A Toronto professor says that at least five times as much salt as the body requires is taken during the day. That is the worst of the habit, which is not uncommon, of taking everything with "a grain of salt."

BUY PURE-BRED SEED

The value of "pedigree" in live stock has been recognized for centuries. It is only within comparatively recent times, however, that the value of "pedigree" in seed grain has come to be realized, and even now many farmers are not as careful as they should be in their choice of seed, says L. H. Newman, Dominion Cerealist.

A study of the reports of the Experimental Farms reveals the extent to which certain varieties excel others in yield as well as in other respects. Thus it will be noted that some varieties stand up better than others on account of the inherited "strength of straw" which they possess, while other sorts ripen earlier than do some of their competitors. It is obvious therefore, that for best returns, "pure seed" of a variety which is well adapted to the district should be insisted on. If the variety grown on a given farm is mixed with other varieties which ripen at different dates, or if the mixtures be "low yielders" naturally, it is clear that the returns will not be so satisfactory as though a high yielding variety consisting of but one strain were used.

All experimental work as well as general observation emphasizes the growing importance to the individual farmer of repeatedly testing a few of the most highly recommended varieties in order that he may not suffer unnecessary losses through the continued use of a variety which, in so far as his particular farm is concerned, should be "scrapped." Once the best variety is determined the propagation of pure seed of that variety may be accomplished quite easily by following some simple system such as that adopted and encouraged by the Canadian Seed Growers' Association. All grain growers should be familiar with this system, details of which may be had by addressing a request for same to the Secretary of the Association at Ottawa.
