Army Started in 1865 The speaker told of the founding of the Army in 1865 by the late Commander William Booth, who, at 21 years of age was in the pulpit. He did not want to leave the church but saw with an almost uncanny accuracy the need of the world, especially the world that lived outside the church and in the slums and oppests of the great cities of the world.

O. A. C. Farmers' Week The Farmers' Week at the O. A. C. will be held on June 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12. Every farmer in Ontario is invited to be present. The farmers of Grey County are supposed to go on Wednesday, June 9. It is hoped seeding will be completed by that date so a large representation of Grey County farmers will be able to attend.

The Vote Polled Referring to the big vote piled up for the O. T. A. in Huron County, the three successful candidates in that county polled 3,000 less votes than were cast for the O. T. A. In the three Greys, the dry majority was 13,600 out of a total vote of 26,185. The dry vote was three times as large as the wet, and 8,000 more votes were polled for the Act than for the three Conservative candidates.

The real start of the Army in India was in the year 1882 when in some manner a copy of the War Cry reached a man named Tucker, who was instrumental in having a corps organized a few years later. Now they have 3,065 churches, 29,000 officers, are represented in 5,000 villages, have 3,499 schools native officers, and have started 476 day schools in India. The Army has 500 Sunday schools in Ontario, and in the city of Peterborough alone, minister to over 8,600 children from 9 to 14 years of age.

Tour 1. Conducted tour of those interested in Field and Animal Husbandry will leave gymnasium immediately after lunch and proceed to Field Husbandry Plots. One and one-quarter hours on the plots with Dr. Zavitz and staff, and then on to swine, beef cattle and dairy cattle with Professor Toole and staff, for three-quarters of an hour. At three o'clock the party leaves dairy barn. Those interested in poultry will be conducted over the poultry plant, and those interested in dairy manufacture will be conducted to the dairy building.

Mr. Hawkes referred to a story of the early times in Glenelg Township told him in Parry Sound District by Rev. James Binnie, of how, when his father, a stiff temperance man first came to the township and held a barn raising, saying that there would be no whiskey at it, was told that nobody would come. He held out for his principles, however, and the barn-raising went on as usual. "Have all the political parties of all time done as much for this country as these first temperance workers?" asked the speaker.

The speaker dealt briefly with the helping hand given women and young girls in their homes, the relief for mothers and children, whereby children were permitted to remain in their homes instead of having to be placed in institutions, the fresh air camps for children, mothers and scouts and girl guides, and the efforts to look after those who by misfortune or otherwise were thrown out of employment. Commandant Hurd appealed to a liberal contribution on the ground that, with their 60 years of experience, the Army can make money go further than any other institution. This was also made possible through the lower salaries paid in the Army. As an instance, he gave the salary of a graduate Army nurse of 19 years' experience whose salary was \$10.65 per week. Of this she paid \$1 per week for board and room. She was a highly trained nurse and had a staff of 17 other nurses under her.

Tour 2. A conducted tour for those interested in dairying and poultry will leave the gymnasium immediately after lunch and proceed to Dairy Department, spending one hour with Professor Dean and staff, and then on to the Poultry Department with Professor Graham and staff for three-quarters of an hour. The party will then proceed to Dairy Cattle stables or to the Agricultural Department. Tour 3. for ladies. Conducted tour will leave the gymnasium immediately after lunch and proceed to Macdonald Institute, and spend one hour with Miss Cruickshank and staff, and then on to the Dairy Building, spending one half hour with Professor Dean and staff. The party will then proceed to Massey Hall where lectures of interest to women will be given. Staff officials will be in all buildings from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. each day, ready to give information and advice on questions of agricultural science and practice. Exhibits will be on view in many of the buildings. An information bureau of campus directory will be established in a tent near the gymnasium, for the convenience of visitors. Departmental bulletins will be available. At four o'clock the campus will be available to the Junior Farmers for baseball games or such other sports as they may see fit to conduct. Plans are being made to have a tour leave the County and attend in a body. The men will be in charge of Messrs. Cooper and Nelson, Agricultural Representative and Assistant, while the ladies will be in charge of Miss Edith Hopkins, a graduate of Macdonald Hall, who is at present in the County training Girls in Judging Work. A full schedule of regulations re the tour are being made. These will be sent out to every farmer writing for information. All farmers owning cars who can conveniently take neighbors and friends are requested to do so. Arrangements re payment of drivers will be left with each party, but next week it is hoped that a suggested rate will be given. Can you go? If so, could you take your neighbor who has no car?

Temperance in the coming campaign was the dominating issue. It was to be a case of the political point of view against the moral point of view. Premier Ferguson had said in effect in his London speech that he would go to the country and come back with the same 75 seats. The 1924 vote was an evidence of the temperance vote. The matter of women in politics was an important one as they constituted 54 per cent of the voters. He advised his hearers not to give their support to any candidate who was not sound on temperance. They should elect a Legislature that will not interfere with the O. T. A. At the present time, a person could take a trip from Ottawa to the Georgian Bay and not pass through a constituency that did not give a dry majority. With the exception of the cities, there were only five counties that gave wet majorities. The cities were incurably wet, he said, and the only course left open to the rural districts was to try and win the cities over and thereby raise their morals. The Legislature could not raise the morals of anything, so rural Ontario must create a public opinion that will win them over. Rural Ontario was the real Ontario.

ROAD ENGINEER COMING SOON (Continued from page 1) hazard manner and, to put the matter plainly, without a proper engineer in charge, neither the ratepayers nor the Department of Provincial Highways have had a proper run for their money. It has been suggested more than once that the proper thing to do would be for the Government to take over all the main roads. In this manner, better roads would be constructed for less money, and the ratepayers saved a considerable amount by having competent men in charge of the work. Some time ago, the Provincial Department stipulated that all county road superintendents should have had a certain experience before their appointments could be made, but this method does not seem to have worked out very well, with the result that the Department has appointed their own men to look after their interests. Roadbuilding today, with the advent of the heavy trucks and busses, is a much greater problem than a few years ago, and it is no doubt felt that better roads can be built more economically when placed in charge of a competent, qualified man than if allowed to proceed under a County Council appointee who may have received his appointment on personal grounds rather than on his ability to build roads. Mr. Hawes, who takes up the work

here, has not yet moved his office to Durham, but will likely do so in the course of a few days. His territory, we understand, will be the counties of Grey, Dufferin and Peel.
