Iodine for Goitre

Mrs. L. D. writes: "My daughter, aged 15 years, has been troubled with goitre for the past two years."

(1) What are the causes of goitre?

(2) We have been using spring water for 18 years.

(3) What is best to do for goitre?

Reply

(1) Goitre is an enlargement of the thyroid gland (one of the ductless glands, located in the neck). The reason the gland enlarges is that there is a deficiency or excess in the endocrines which nature strives to compensate by increased activity of the thyroid. That is a purely physiological enlargement, and generally takes care of itself.

MISS MACPHAIL HAS REAL OPPONENT ROBT. T. EDWARDS

Chesley Enterprise Says He's an Able Man and Has "Made Good."

The political views of the Chesley Enterprise, edited by Mr. William McDonald, a former M.P.P., are always interesting, and the editorial on Mr. Robert T. Edwards, the Conservative candidate in South Grey, is no exception.

"Robert T. Edwards, a prominent farmer of Glenelg Township was the unanimous choice of the Conservative party of the riding as their standard-bearer at the approaching election at a largely-attended convention in Durham on the 26 ult. It will be a bonnie fight between the Glenelg farmer and the Maid of Ceylon. At the convention in Durham, R. J. Ball, ex-M.P., dubbed Miss Macphail a Red because she associated with Woodsworth, a Labor member from Winnipeg.

"The genial and clean-living Bob Edwards of Glenelg is no relative of the late Bob Edwards of Calgary Eye-Opener fame, but he will produce an eye-opener in the riding, and all over Canada, too, if he defeats the redoubtable Agnes Macphail, the only woman candidate in the general election. While Bob Edwards of Glenelg is a great admirer of the fair sex, the fact that his opponent wears a skirt will not hold him back from making her take a man's place in the political rough and tumble."

THE ELEPHANT SEAL

The Mexican Government Saves This Rare Mammal From Destruction.

The elephant seal is a huge, clumsy beast with a flexible trunk or snout, which of old males, reaches a maximum length of sixteen inches. It is a giant compared to the ordinary seals seen along the beaches. An elephant seal may grow to be twenty feet long and weigh almost a ton.

The trunk, which inspired its name, appears to serve no useful purpose except as a resonator. When the elephant seal throws back its head to utter its snore-like call, the end of the trunk, blown full of air like a toy balloon, is thrust into the widely-open mouth. Scientists believe that the elephant seal is a survivor of an ancient lineage, not properly belonging to the present age of highly-organized creatures. This viewpoint is strengthened by the fact that it sheds its skin, the cuticle peeling off in large flakes.

This strange creature was once abundant along the Pacific Coast, but when whalers learned that it yielded a valuable oil, slaughter began, and it became so scarce that it was thought the species had become extinct. Fortunately, it was discovered that the remnant north of the equator had chosen Gaudalupe Island for a last stand.

Gaudalupe Island is the westernmost possession of Mexico, located about 180 miles southwest of San Diego, California. The island, an extinct volcano, and uninhabited, is 20 miles long and three miles wide. It was once the refuge of a herd of rare fur seals numbering no less than 100,000, now completely exterminated by hunters who left the island strewn with bones.

Recently a group of scientists visited Gaudalupe Island. It was found that the elephant seal herd had increased to over 800. As soon as possible after their return to the mainland, the scientists petitioned the Mexican government to make Gaudalupe a reservation. This was done almost immediately. Now unauthorized landing on Gaudalupe is prohibited, and no one is permitted to

moist an elephant seal within three miles of the shores. Heavy penalties have been fixed for violation of the protecting measures.

Such acts help American friends of Mexico to convince their more critical and less patient countrymen that Mexican leaders are sincere in their efforts to lead their people into the highways of justice, happiness and prosperity.
