Have you seen the cunning new kitchen curtains of voile? They're adorable and washable as well. As soon as I saw them, I determined to have some for myself.

Of course, I don't know how much material you will need, because your windows undoubtedly differ from mine in size, but you can measure their length and then purchase the necessary amount for either sash or full length curtains, as you wish.

First, I stenciled a tea-towel design of plates and cups at the bottom of each curtain. You can either draw your own design or buy the patterns. I bought mine because it is so much easier to apply a ready-made transfer, and there is a wide variety from which to select.

Then, with colored thread, I outlined the "pictures" and crocheted a border around each curtain. Since my predominating color (in the embroidery) was blue, I made my edge of blue also.

It takes very little time to make these, and you will be delighted with the many compliments you receive after the curtains are up.

RECIPE

Cream Puffs

1 cup of water 1/3 cup of liquid fat 1 cup of flour 1/2 teaspoonful of salt 4 eggs

Bring water and liquid fat to a boil. Add flour and salt and cook until mixture leaves sides of pan, stirring constantly. Remove from fire. Cool and add unbeaten eggs, one at a time, beating thoroughly after each egg is added.

Fill with sweetened whipped cream flavored with vanilla and sprinkle powdered sugar on top of each.

NEW TREATMENT FOR SMUTTY WHEAT

Ontario farmers have for years been taking heavy losses on account of growing smutty wheat. These losses in the aggregate each season will run well over one million dollars, and we have known individual farmers who have taken discounts of from 5 cents to 15 cents per bushel on from 500 bushels to 3,000 bushels.

Directions for Copper Carbonate Dust Treatment

The dust should be applied at the rate of two or three ounces per bushel of wheat. Place the grain to be treated in a barrel or churn, about a bushel at a time. Add the required amount of copper carbonate dust, and then revolve the barrel or churn until the dust is thoroughly mixed with the grain.

Copper carbonate may be secured from almost any Toronto dealer at 25 cents per pound delivered, although in some places as high as \$1.25 per pound is being charged.

Three-Year-Old Boy Found After Many Hours' Search.

Rev. T. A. Gooding, Menonite minister at Port Elgin, went Saturday to a bush belonging to J. McArthur on the Gore road about five miles from Port Elgin to cut some wood for himself.

About noon the father missed the boy and started to search for him. He continued his search without success until 5 p.m., when he went to a farmhouse and phoned Port Elgin for assistance.

At 6 o'clock on Sunday morning, the fire alarm was sounded again and another search party was organized, with the result that the lad was located by Dr. Fraser about 7:30 a.m. sitting on a log.
