BEAUTY OF SHIPS APPEALS TO MODERNS

If the sailing ship is being driven off the seas, it is having a grand run in the advertising pages. Whether one has shoes or cabbage to sell, he says it with ships. They are all romantic shapes now, and the Spanish galleys is hardly more galleon-like than the clipper of yesterday; for romance, perhaps the softening haze of time is essential. Ruskin, who lived in the days of sail when steam was but the vulgar and noisome interloper depicted by Turner in his painting of "The Fighting Temeraire" being towed to her last berth, saw nothing romantic or beautiful in the big merchant ships that he saw. He found beauty in the colored sails of the picturesque craft laden with melons or pomegranates in Venetian canals, in bluff-nosed Dutch fishing boats, or in the dilapidated Thames barges that crept along the British coasts. But the great ships of commerce seemed to him uninteresting and even detestable, mere Babbitt of the deep.

Looked Vulgar to Ruskin

In the retrospect even the prosperous packets and cargo-carriers which Ruskin thought vulgar and commonplace look less prosaic with the light of their last sunset on their sails. To the decorative artist of to-day all ships are much alike, and any sort of sale will do to advertise a book, an automobile, a suit of clothes, or a new brand of coffee or cigars. Lateen, tug, sprit, square, or fore-and-aft, they have all become shapes of romance. Has our own age anything equally good to bequeath? Inquires the Springfield Republican. This is doubtful for modern achievement does not run greatly to shape. What is the shape of a phonograph, a radio telephone, a camera? Invention nowadays has to do with the insides of things, and form is largely a matter of accident. An automobile must have wheels, engine, transmission and steering gear and also some protection for the passengers. But these requirements in its lines may be pretty much what fancy and fashion dictate, and consequently old styles look as absurd as the clothes of a decade ago. There is no such absurdity in the obsolete forms of things that have developed under the stern pressure of reality.

Collecting Ship Models

If marine architecture were ever absurd it would be those floating palaces which the Mediterranean nation sent to sea in the florid days of the Renaissance, galleons with towering forecastles and lofty poop, embellished with balconies, and elaborate carvings. Yet they were a true expression of their age, and for southern seas they were perhaps not so ridiculous as they seemed to northerners, used to the fogs and gales of the German ocean. Atlantic storms and conflicts with armed ships of handier types made an end of this florid architecture, yet it should not be supposed that the lofty structures which now seem quaint pictures—were merely added for show. On the contrary, they were a survival of the battle platform of the old Roman galleys; the forecastle was really a castle, and was built high to give the fighters on it the upper hand. An interesting modern development is the cult of the ship model. Several superb collections have been made, and the number of collectors in a modest way grows. Genuine old models are highly esteemed and sometimes bring a fancy price, but there is a place, too, for replicas, and an astonishing number of people with some mechanical aptitude and no adequate outlet for it are finding pleasure in making comet models of sailing craft of different types.

Model Yacht Contests

This may be related to the craze for races between model yachts which is no longer confined to small boys. Even adults, who have a taste for boats and no opportunity to gratify it may find much satisfaction in studying the principles of design and in constructing models that embody their notions of speed. Even from the bank of a wading pool a race of toy ships can be a thrilling event to their builders and backers. If the present revival of interest in sailing ships continues to grow it might well lead to the construction of models on a little larger scale, for use on ponds and other sheltered waters. Why should there not be "full-riggers," replicas on a small scale of famous old galleons, made of such a size that a boy or even a grown-up could climb aboard to handle the innumerable sheets, halliards, braces and gaskets?

The Quest of Beauty

A remarkable exhibition of ship models was held not long ago in London, a feature of which was the large number of fine specimens submitted by amateurs. Visitors were impressed by the high quality of the workmanship, and also by the prodigious labor involved in getting the details as nearly correct as possible. Evidently there must be a great store of latent mechanical skill of which industry at present is not making use. The making of models of obsolete things may be a fascinating hobby, but the labor involved might seem rather extravagant for people in their daily work for mechanical aptitude pure and simple there is always an outlet, if only in the making of a radio set; the instinct that sets adult people to making finely-executed models of brigs, schooners, barks and full-rigged ships, involves a taste of a different sort, including a real feeling for beauty. They are having a splendid time in carving out shapes of beauty and romance, but it is a pity that the workaday world gives them so little chance to develop their powers into artistic creativeness.
