Conditions Growing Worse

"I see no reason," he said, "to retract anything that I said about the O.T.A. in my charge to the Synod of Huron in 1924. In spite of the enorous sum of about \$400.-000 a year spent since on the enforcement, conditions have grown steadily worse than they were then. The millennial blessings promised by the advocates-of the O.T.A. have not been realized; but, on the contrary, our jails are more crowded, crime is on the increase, especially among the young, and there are more deaths directly traceable to alcolholism than in the days before the O.T.A.

"It has done more to encourage deceit and subterfuge, more to demoralize the youth of the country and to create a general disrespect for law than all the other causes combined, during the 10 years of its evistence. With some misgivings I voted for the O.T.A. as a war measure. But now, after 10 years' experience, I am firmly convinced that to perpetuate it as a permanent order will be disastrous.


