Most all of us consider mashed potatoes so easy to prepare that we pay little attention to them. However is there anything worse than watery ones? I have never been able to eat this delectable dish with the proper relish because at one time Choice assortment flowering bulbs during a very impressionable time



If your mashed potatoes are the kind that make every guest ask for more you won't need the recipe I'm giving you today. But, if yours aren't always perfect, try my way and none of you guests will ever have the unpleasant experience that I

Mashed Potatoes

Peel potatoes and boil slowly in salt water (barely to cover) until soft: remove from fire and pour off water. Mash with wooden or metal potato masher. When potatoes are reduced to a pulp, add warm milk or cream slowly (so as not to have the finished dish too soft) and a tablespoon of butter. Beat with a spoon (preferably perforated) until creamy pepper and salt to taste; remove to dish; garnish with bits of parsley and butter; sprinkle lightly with paprika, if desired and serve.

As for the candied sweet potatoes there are several methods by which good results may be procured. However I like this recipe best because the sweet syrup seems to penetrate the potatoes more thoroughly in boiling than it can if it is poured over them and all the cooking is done in the oven:

Candied Sweet Potatoes

If you desire another vegetable why not serve beets? Cook the beets slowly for two or two and a half hours until a fork will pierce them easily. Remove from water, skin and cool. Slice and place in a dish season to taste with salt and pepper and cover with vinegar. If you like hot beets better than soured ones, slice while warm, season with salt and pepper and pour melted butter over the vegetable.
