Meeting in caucus at Toronto last Friday, Progressive members of the Ontario Legislature re-elected W. E. Raney as House leader and appointed J. W. Widdfield, member for North Ontario, party whip, in succession to J. W. Freeborn, of East Middlesex, who resigned his seat to contest a constituency in the last federal election.

Mr. Raney had no statement to make at the end of the day's deliberations. It is understood, however, that discussion centred in the possibility of the Progressive group securing recognition as the official Opposition instead of the Liberal group, which enjoyed that distinction during the last Legislature.

Of the 49 Progressive and Liberal Progressive members of the Legislature, 12 attended the caucus. They were: Mr. Raney (Prince Edward Island), D. J. Taylor (Grey North), T. K. Slack (Dufferin), Christopher Gardiner (East Kent), J. W. Widdfield (North Ontario), M. A. McCallum (South Bruce), W. G. Mead (South Huron), R. Kemp (Lincoln), E. C. Sandy (Victoria South), D. M. Ross (Oxford North), J. G. Lettbridge (Middlesex West) and H. C. Nixon (Brant).

E. C. Drury, former premier of the province; R. H. Halbert, party organizer; J. M. Warren, Party Secretary; and Dr. H. S. Coyne also took part in the caucus.

Major Kidd gained political distinction in the recent provincial elections by defeating W. F. Nickle, E. C. formerly attorney-general, who broke with the Conservative party over the Government control of liquor issue and ran as a Prohibitionist.
