Reforestation of Waste Lands

The County of Norfolk has led in the way of reforestation of waste lands, so that any opinion on the subject, from that county is worthy of consideration.

"The Norfolk County Chamber of Commerce believes there is a necessity for legislation that will encourage the reforesting of greater areas of the province's unproductive acreage.

"It further believes that a necessary factor towards the accomplishment of the end sought is provincial-wide compulsory legislation, exempting such areas, when devoted to reforestation, from any increased valuation for yearly tax purposes over that of similar unplanted lands in the same district.

"It, therefore, urges upon the Government of the province the enacting of legislation similar to that recently passed by the State of New York, which, during the period of growth limits the yearly unplanted lands in the same tax district and provides for a cutting tax of a fixed percentage of the stumpage value of the timber at the time of cutting.

With this resolution The Free Press is in hearty agreement. There is no question as to the necessity of increasing the reforesting of greater areas of the province's unproductive areas. It is sound business that while the trees on such areas are in the growing stage and unproductive they should not be subjected to any additional taxation over that of unplanted areas of poor land in the same district.

Reforestation in Old Ontario is of vital importance for many reasons. From the standpoint of actual wealth, for the sake of the beauty of Ontario, to preserve our water sources, to protect our bird life and to insure a continuation of our climate it is absolutely essential that there should be a general policy of reforestation.

New York State is preparing to tackle the task of reforestation in a big way. It is figured that there are four million acres which the state can purchase and plant with trees. It is proposed to set aside \$100,000,000 for this work and 50 years from now it is estimated these forests will be worth a billion and a half dollars to the state.
