Meandering with Marjorie



I played bridge, not long ago, at the home of a hostess, part of the charm of whose parties lies in her careful attention to detail. Everything, it seemed to me, was perfect. The sandwiches, especially, intrigued me. They were in the forms of diamonds, hearts, spades and clubs appropriately covered. The hearts and diamonds were pimento cheese, cherry and cream cheese and strawberry jam. The clubs and spades were ripe olive, caviar and grape conserve.

Do You Know That? 1. Nuts are a highly concentrated food because their water content is low? 2. Almonds, butternuts and peanuts contain more protein than an equal weight of meat and therefore are often used as meat substitutes. 3. Salt has no influence on the digestibility of nuts, but does improve the flavor of those rich in fat? 4. The low temperature of cold storage is necessary if nuts are to be kept through warm weather because they deteriorate chiefly by becoming wormy, rancid or musty? 5. Shelled nuts absorb moisture from the air very quickly, and so should be kept in air-tight jars and when necessary heated in the oven to restore their crispness.

RECIPE Fruit Punch Sandwiches 1 cake of cream cheese softened with cream. 1/3 cup of chopped candied orange peel. 1/4 cup of chopped nuts. 1 teaspoon of vanilla. Whole wheat bread. Mix ingredients and spread between thin, buttered slices of bread.

Baked Fudge Cook, until blended, two ounces of bitter chocolate and one-half a cupful of melted butter. Beat three eggs; add one cupful of sugar and three-fourths of a cupful of flour which has been sifted twice with one-half teaspoonful of salt and one-half teaspoonful of baking powder. Combine these mixtures and add a cupful of nuts and one teaspoonful of vanilla. Pour into greased dripping pan and bake twenty-five minutes in moderate oven. Cut in squares.

WOMEN'S INSTITUTE NOW WORLD WIDE FORMED 30 YRS. AGO

Recent Meeting of Stoney Creek Branch of Interest to Every Institute Member, When Thirtieth Anniversary Was Celebrated

It is a long way from Durham to Stoney Creek, in Wentworth County and, under ordinary conditions, the meeting of the Women's Institute branch of that place, is, perhaps, of no particular interest to readers of The Chronicle. This is not true of the last meeting, for this was the celebration of the thirtieth anniversary of the birth of the Women's Institute as a society, that, originating at Stoney Creek, now boasts members and branches in all parts of the world.

It would not be too broad a statement, we think, to say that there are many enthusiastic Institute members in Durham and vicinity who know very little about the early days of this well-known society, and it is altogether likely that they will learn considerable from a perusal of the article that follows, taken from the Toronto Mail and Empire of Monday of this week. The article says:

Emotions that lie deep below the surface were stirred, the other night, as the eye roved over a gathering that filled a large hall when the Stoney Creek branch of the Women's Institutes celebrated the thirtieth anniversary of the society that has gone out into all lands. For the inward eye saw, as in a pageant, the thousands and tens of thousands of rural women, who are now banded together for betterment because a Canadian man and a Canadian woman—Erland Lee and Adelaide Hoodless, possessed vision, and its needful ally, courage.

Both have passed over to the other side, but their work lives on, and the other night at the thirtieth birthday banquet, their memory was honored by a silent toast. Thirty years ago Erland Lee heard a talk by Mrs. Hoodless, a pioneer in the cause of setting the domestic side of woman's work on a broad and recognized basis. Later, when the Farmer's Institute met at Stoney Creek, and some of the wives came up (chiefly to see that their lords and masters were properly fed) Mr. Lee asked Mrs. Hoodless for an address, and out of this grew the idea that an association for mutual helpfulness (such as the F. I. was meant to be) should be formed for the women.

"How many of the women would care for such an association?" asked the father of the idea, and thirty-five stood up. So it was decided to have an organization meeting one week later, with Mrs. Hoodless as adviser-in-chief. In the meantime Mr. and Mrs. Lee studied the constitution and every thing they could find bearing on the matter, and on the day of organization no less than 101 women joined the young society. The president chosen was Mrs. E. D. Smith, wife of Senator Smith; the Secretary Miss Nash; treasurer, Mrs. J. F. Felker. Of these Mrs. Smith and Mrs. Felker were present among the charter members at the birthday banquet. Mrs. Smith cutting the birthday cake, whose thirty blue and yellow candles had been lighted by the present superintendent of the Federated Women's Institutes of Ontario, Mr. G. A. Putnam.

Well and Truly Laid That little society formed in February, 1897, was laid on a fine foundation, testimony to this being borne by the fact that it has been little changed from that time to this—its lines were broad enough to allow for the expanding years. In looking over the society's first minute book, when spanning the night with Mrs. A. E. Walker, at "Elmhurst Farm," I found this entry: "The object of this Institute shall be to promote that knowledge of household science which shall tend to improvement in household architecture, with special attention to sanitation, to a better understanding of the economic and hygienic value of foods and fuels, and to a more scientific care of children, with a view to raising the general standard of the life of our people."

There were to be six divisions of study, and experiment—Domestic economy; Architecture—sanitation; light, heat, etc.; Physiology—hygiene, medicine, calisthenics, etc.; Floriculture and Horticulture; Music and Art; Literature—sociology, education and legislation.

You will see from this that the new society for the help of the rural woman was not, as many of the detractors chose to say, merely a meeting place for the exchange of recipes and the latest local gossip. Some time after its inception, when it had proved itself a thriving infant, with prospects of multiplying, Mr. Lee had the new society made a Government ward with a Government grant and had it placed under the jurisdiction of the Department of Agriculture. The motto, "For Home and Country," under which the British and other institutes also work, was chosen by Mrs. Hoodless in 1902.

Ancient History Relived Squire's Hall, where the W. I. first saw the light was burnt about two years ago, so the banquet took place in the hall of the Presbyterian church, which was gay with gold and blue bunting, the Institute colors.
