

Large Number of Accidents Reported To Workmen's Compensation Board.

There were 5,231 accidents reported to the Workmen's Compensation Board in Ontario in February according to the figures given out by R. B. Morley, general manager, Industrial Accident Prevention Association. The total number reported in February exceeds by nearly 600 the figures for February of a year ago. The fatalities in February, 1927, were about the same as in the same month of 1926, being 27 and 26 respectively. The benefits, however, awarded during February 1927, were less than the figures for 1926 by
