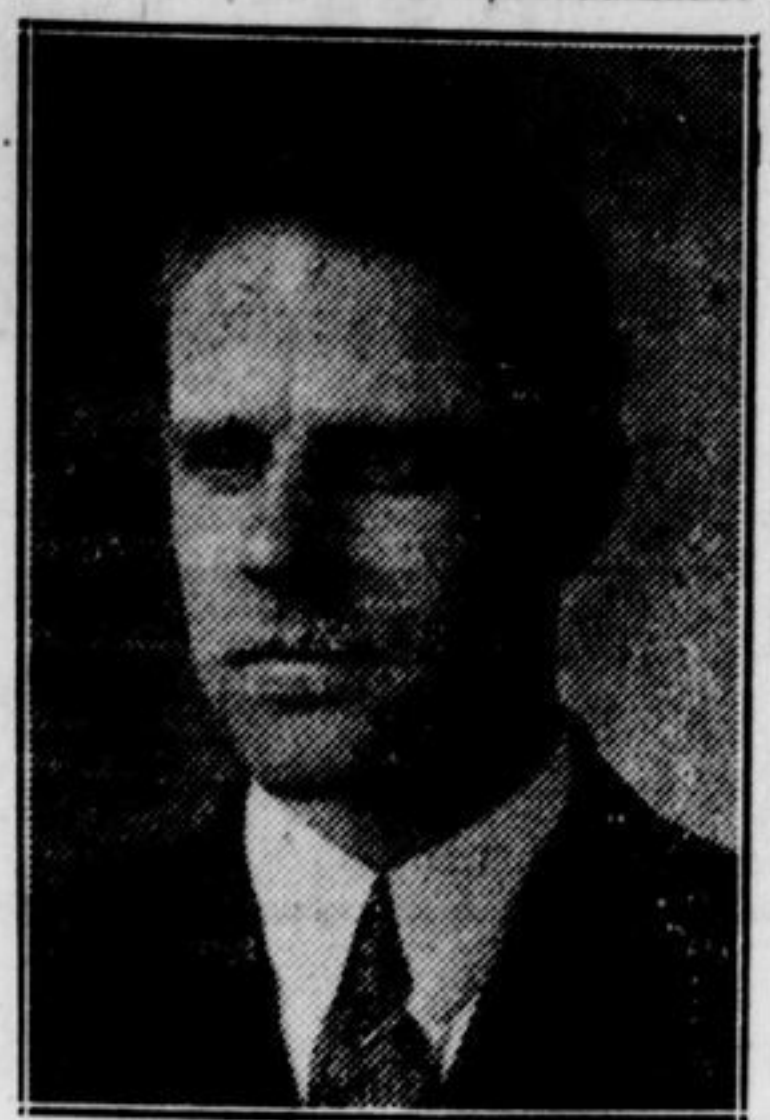

After a sojourn in Windsor since the car selling season closed last fall, Mr. and Mrs. A. F. McCabe returned to their home at Varney last week...

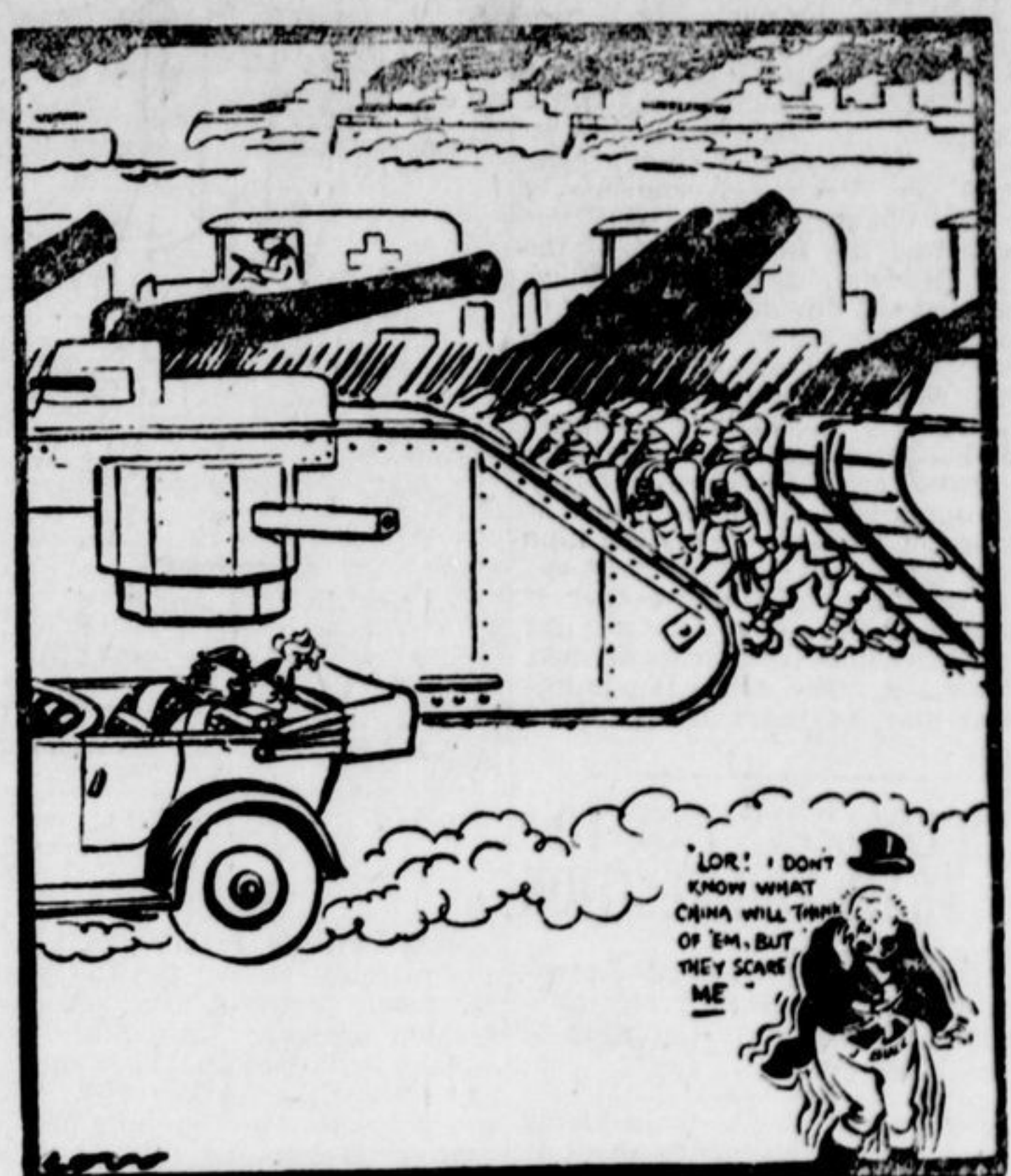
