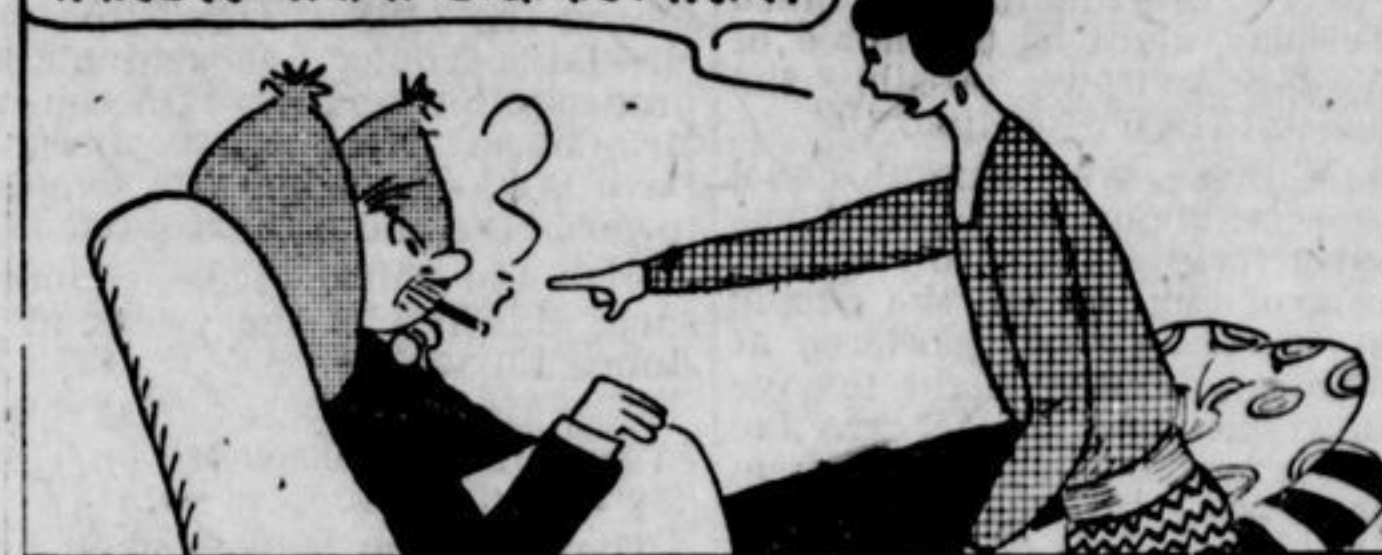

U. S. JEWISH FARMERS

A significant diversion of Jewish immigrants from cities and towns to the farms of the United States is reported by the Jewish Agricultural Society of New York. Twenty-five years ago the Jewish farm population in that country was only 1,000, but today it numbers 75,000. A million acres are now being farmed by Jews, the value of whose real and personal property is more than \$100,000,000. There are promising agricultural Jewish colonies in all of the New England states and also in New Jersey, and scattered Jewish farmers are becoming more and more common. In some cases old English towns like Colchester, Conn., have passed almost entirely into the hands of Jewish farmers. This process is taking place chiefly in the older states and districts, and it proves that the Jewish farmers are succeeding where the original

New England farmers gave up the job. "Certainly no one can complain," says the Boston Transcript, "if the Jewish people take advantage of an opportunity which Yankees are giving up, especially as the success of the Jewish farmers is gained through the exhibition of the same qualities as those with which our fathers wrung their modest fortunes out of the hard soil."
