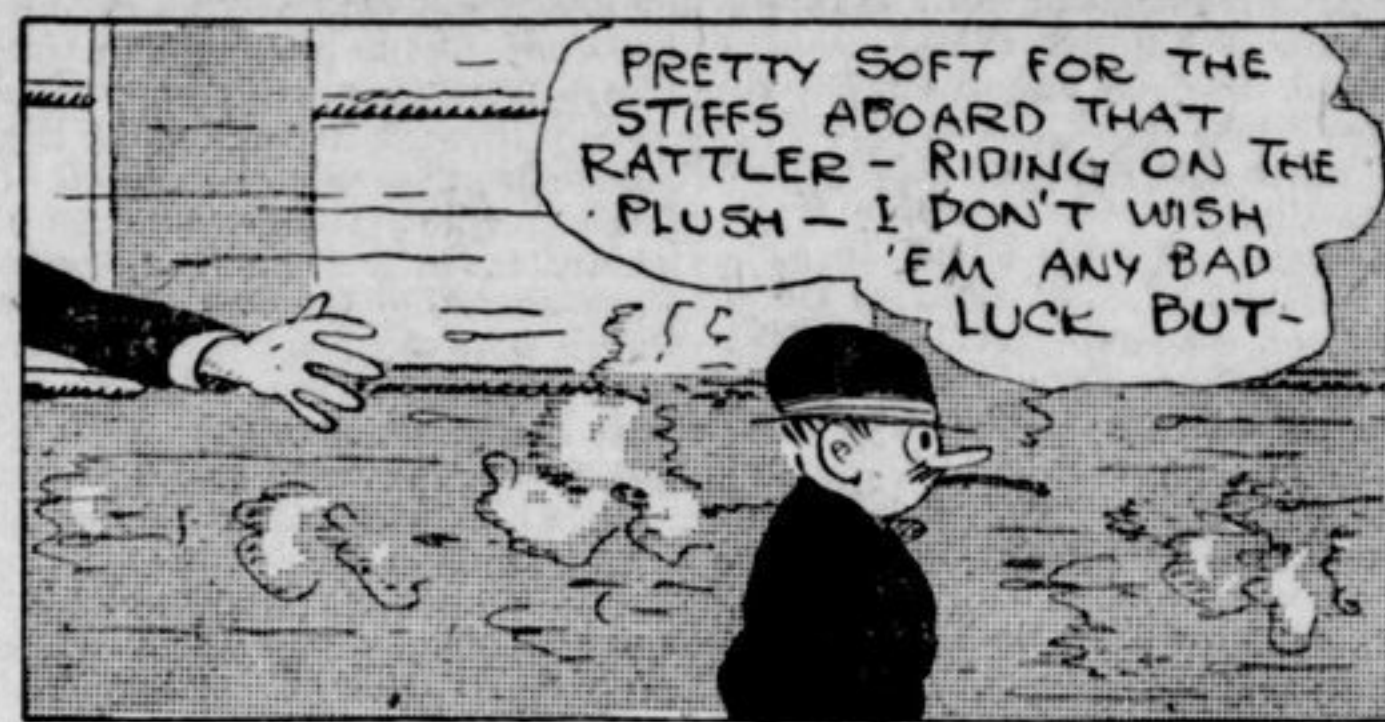

COLIN G. GROFF TO SUPERINTEND MARKETING TOUR

Newly Appointed Official Has Already Taken Over Duties, With Headquarters at Montreal.

Announcement is made by Dr. W. J. Black, Director of Colonization and Agriculture of the Canadian National Railways, of the appointment of Colin G. Groff, former publicity commissioner of the Government of Alberta, to the position of superintendent of the marketing tour now being organized by the colonization department of the railway.

Organization work for the marketing tour, which was announced some time ago, is now going forward. This tour is being undertaken under the auspices of the colonization and agriculture department of the Canadian National Railways with the object of providing an opportunity for Canadian farmers and agriculturists to study conditions under which Canadian agricultural products are marketed in Great Britain.

Provision will, of course, be made for visits to historic spots and for other sight-seeing and entertainment features. Already a great deal of interest has been indicated in

Britain in the coming visit of the party, and there is assurance that the Canadian farmers who take advantage of the tour will receive a most enthusiastic welcome.
