AUTOISTS CANNOT ESCAPE

Motorists of Ontario touring in other provinces and in the United States, will feel the "long arm of the law" extended to their own home if they commit offences while on their trips, according to Hon. Geo. S. Henry.

"At the quarterly meeting of the Eastern Conference of Motor Vehicle Administrators just concluded in Philadelphia," he stated, "Ontario entered into an arrangement whereby member states agree to suspend or revoke the license of a resident who committed an offense in another state or province which, if committed at home would result in suspension of license.

A POLITICAL ANOMALY

In the old days when politics were taken seriously by many cases caused a cleavage between neighbors and converted close friends into enemies for life. The children of parents wedded to one party were sometimes forbidden to play with little ones of their own age growing up amid the evil influences of the opposite creed. Sir Alexander Mackenzie, the four Scot Premier of Canada from 1873 to 1878, probably expressed the opinion entertained amongst devout Liberals when he said: "The heart of the average Tory is deceitful above all things, and desperately wicked."

As evidence of the waning hatred between politicians we have the example of Canada's present Prime Minister (with Liberal leanings, it is said) going to the Honorable John S. Martin, Ontario's Minister of Agriculture, and a Tory of Tories for a setting of White Wyandotte eggs. The Rt. Hon. Mr. Mackenzie King has become infected with the "chicken virus" and is attempting to eke out his meagre income by raising a few chicks on his farm in the Gattineau. If the Prime Minister had remembered the declaration of his predecessor of 1873-78 he would, no doubt, have overlooked the excellence of the Honorable Mr. Martin's flock and taken his basket on his arm to the henyard of some flock that laid good Grit eggs.

Here, at any rate, is a precedent, and surely it is no longer traitorous to one's party to have honest business connections with adherents of another party. Liberals, in a pinch, might change work with Tories, and in case of silo fillings and threshings it might even be permissible to invite a few U.F.O. and Progressives.—Farmer's Advocate

Police Probe DEATH OF BABE

Found Dead in Cradle at Eden Grove Home.—Jury Views Remains and Adjourns to June 17.

The crown authorities are investigating the circumstances in connection with the death of a three-week-old baby girl of Mr. and Mrs. George Childs, of Eden Grove, a short distance north of Cargill.

The parents reported that the infant had been found dead in its cradle on Friday morning. The coroner, Dr. H. G. Joyce of Cargill, following an examination of the body, immediately notified the authorities and ordered an inquest. Provincial Officer E. G. Widmeyer, of Walkerton, had the body removed to the undertaking parlors at Cargill and an inquest was opened. After viewing the remains the inquest was adjourned until Friday, June 17.

The couple are about 25 years of age and have a family of three children, all girls, aged nine, four and two. Childs is employed as a mill hand.
