

Canada's Newest Locomotive



The illustration depicts the new "6100" class locomotive, the latest pro-I duction of the mechanical department of the Canadian National Railways. Forty of these "Northern Type" engines have been manufactured in Canadian plants for use of main line fast passenger and manifest freight service. They are 93 feet 1034 inches over all. The tender has a capacity of 11,300 imperial gallons of water and 20 tons of coal. In working order the total weight of engine and tender is 638,000 pounds. Note the new position of the whistle, located on the left hand of the smoke box near the stack. This is to save the driver's ears. These engines are designed for power at speed and it is estimated that they can make 90 miles an hour with a heavy train.
