COUNTRY RADIO SETS
MUST BE PROTECTED

Unless Properly Installed May Attract Lightning.—Simple Device Needed.

Special precautions against lightning are needed in installing a radio receiving set in the country. Along the concession lines there are not enough high-tension wires and underground pipes to carry away lightning charges as in the city. The man in the country has the advantage of clearer reception, on account of no interference from near-by sets, but he should use extra care in installing.

Be Careful About Masts

The masts which hold up the aerial on the roof, warns Deputy Fire Marshal George F. Lewis, should never be higher than the terminals of the lightning rod system, and if the building is not rodded it is a bad practice to have the aerial on the roof of any building.

"The safest plan is to have these wires strung from masts placed at a short distance from the house. But this precaution alone is not enough, as lightning may strike the aerial, travelling down through the radio set in the house, burning and wrecking everything in its path. To prevent such an accident, country radio users are advised to install a double throw, single pole, knife switch between the aerial and the set. This switch must be of ample size, at least four inches long, and the blade half an inch wide. The centre post of the

switch is connected to the aerial, and at one end to the radio set and the other to a wire leading outside and down to a good ground connection. When the set is not in use the switch should connect the aerial with the ground so that lightning would be carried safely around the receiving apparatus. A tag should also be attached to the set warning people not to use the same during an electrical storm."

"No radio set should be installed without an approved lightning arrester," concludes the Deputy Fire Marshal, "but this piece of equipment should not be confused with lightning rods. The arrester is a simple device for protecting the radio receiving apparatus only."

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
