AMUSEMENT TAX WILL DISAPPEAR

Admissions of Twenty-five Cents and Under Are Freed of Nuisance.

Commencing Tuesday, November 1, the Ontario amusement tax will be abolished on all amusements admissions of 25 cents and under.

The tax, brought in years ago as a war measure, remains when the price of admission exceeds 25 cents. According to the estimate of officials of the Provincial Treasury...

Based on the 1926 figures of the Amusement Tax collection, it will mean a saving to the people of upward of half a million dollars.

"The policy of exemption from the tax, as applied to entertainments of a charitable, religious or patriotic nature, will be continued," declared the Hon. J. D. Monteith, commenting on the alterations to the Amusement Tax Act...
