VALUE OF POULTRY ACCOUNTS

(Experimental Farms Note.) A poultry account is a year's record, November 1st to October 31st, of the expenses incurred in operating a poultry yard and of the amounts received from the sale of its products. It includes an inventory at the beginning and end of the poultry year and should show when closed, the amount which the venture has paid the operator for his labor.

In 1915 an effort was made by the Poultry Division of the Central Experimental Farm, Ottawa, to encourage poultry keepers to keep records and accounts. For this purpose special sheets called "Farm, Egg and Poultry Accounts" were prepared and forwarded to those requesting them. The venture proved so encouraging that to date farmers, small holders and numerous other classes from coast to coast are keeping records on the revised monthly forms supplied free by the Experimental Farm.

The keeping of such a monthly record does not interfere with any special or practical method of care or management. He may buy and sell whenever he sees fit, providing that a record is kept of the change in the flock. The egg yield is to be noted each day and credited at market prices, whether sold in the house, incubator or sold. The various columns of the sheet are to be filled in at the time of the transactions. In this way the hens are given the credit they deserve. By filling a bin in the hen house with grain once a month and providing a good sized mash hopper, the trouble of keeping account of the feed is reduced to the minimum.

As the summary of these records should furnish very valuable data, a duplicate copy is mailed to the Poultry Division promptly at the end of each month. In acknowledgement of this information, a monthly letter of hints stressing some subjects of importance is mailed to the correspondent. Should the report contain correspondence or questions this matter is immediately attended to. Only those who return the monthly reports receive the letters of suggestions.

All monthly records should be examined at the end of the year to note particularly from what item the greatest income has been derived, whether from market or hatching eggs, market poultry or breeding stock and to study the expenses with relation to the receipts. Such a record properly kept not only affords pleasure but is a guide for future operations. Thus, the poultry man who is able to answer the following questions is the man who watches every little detail and makes note of it, and only when such definite records have been kept, has any great advance in production or real progress been made:

What was the average production of your flock last year?
What is your annual poultry expense and income?
What does it cost to produce a dozen eggs?
What did it cost to produce a laying pullet?
What are your plans for the coming year?

TONS OF BUTTONS USED IN FILMING "MY OLD DUTCH"

Coster Mongers' Festival in Coming Strand Feature Cleans Out Wholesale.

Two tons of pearl buttons went into the making of "My Old Dutch" Universal's quaint story of London coster life, which comes to the Veterans' Star Theatre on Friday and Saturday, November 4 and 5, with May McAvoy, Pat O'Malley, Cullen Landis and Jean Hersholt heading an all star cast.

The principal characters in the opening of the story are London costers, who wear clothing elaborately trimmed with pearl buttons. Several hundred costers appear in the festival scenes, each wearing a costume trimmed with from 800 to 1500 pearl buttons. The studio ransacked the wholesale houses of the entire Pacific coast to obtain enough buttons for the opening spectacle.

"My Old Dutch" is a love story that carries its characters through a lifetime. Five different ages are depicted by the use of clever make-up in the new picture, much as was done in "Milestone" on the stage. Miss McAvoy and O'Malley start as a young couple and close as an aged couple, while Cullen Landis plays their son, grown to manhood. 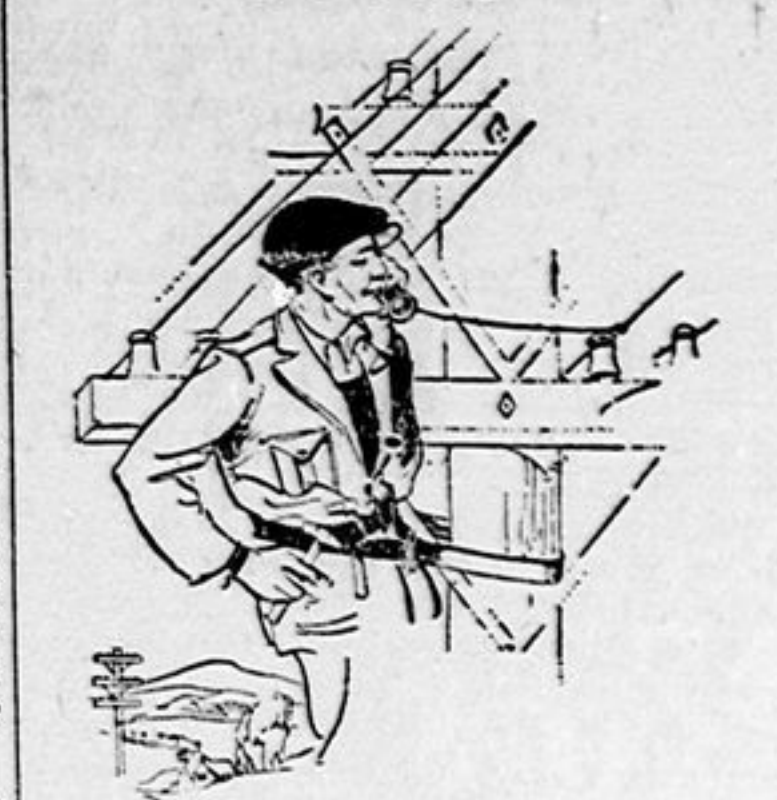
