(Experimental Farms Note.) In districts where, owing to cool, moist weather during the summer months, corn is uncertain, mixtures of grains such as oats, peas and vetch will usually give better results as an ensilage crop. In general such mixtures will grow at lower temperatures than corn, and on land where surface water is readily disposed of, are not harmed by frequent precipitation and continued dull weather. 


